

B3100 is an irregularly shaped trench ~9m east-west and ~10m north-south at its widest points. It is bordered to the north by wall **D310** and area of EIA packing to east of it. It is bordered to the east by wall **B3109**, **B3110**, and the western wall of trench **B2200**. It is bordered to the south by the remainder of a baulk west of trench **B1500**. It is bordered to the west by an arbitrary N-S line about 3m west of wall **B3107**. Architecture exposed divided the trench into several discrete areas. In the northern-central portion of the trench (just south of **D300**), a possibly exterior space is defined to the north by wall **D310**, to the east by wall **B3104**, to the west by wall **B3107**, and to the south by a bedrock outcrop in the central portion of the trench. This area is ~5m N-S by ~4m E-W. South of this area is an area described to the east by the western wall of **B2200**, to the west by what was a possible continuation of wall **B3107** (removed), to the north by the central bedrock outcrop, and to the south by the trench border (baulk). In the southeastern portion of this area, there are what look to be (slipped) built features which may represent the remains of a stairway leading east into **B2200**, an exterior platform, or both. To the west of the "stairway" is an area of regular stones which may represent the remains of paving. In the northeastern portion of the trench, the remains of what is likely an EIA building are represented. This area is described to the north by the trench border (a line extending east from the east end of wall **D310**), to the east by walls **B3109** and **B3110**, to the south by wall **B3111**, and to the west by wall **B3104**. This area is dominated by a bedrock outcrop. Finally, the area west of wall **B3107** was not defined architecturally. Excavation in this area revealed what may be bedding for the area to the east of it, possibly mixed with eroded soil.

Excavation in the B3100 area this season was conducted to explore the area to south of D300 and to the west of B2200 storage/processing complexes to determine whether the area represented a continuation of the complex. Excavation also explored the EIA architecture exposed in the floor of B2200 and its continuation to the north. Excavation of B3100 began 14 June 2005 and was completed 14 July 2005. Trench assistants were Rachel McCleery, John Day, Karen Dunford, and Ida Pohoriljakova. Trench workers were Metina Papadakis and Panogiotis Pazakos.

Verbose Pail Descriptions:

Archaic exterior space:

Pails **B3101.1-3** removed ~20cm of topsoil from entire trench area. Pails **B3102.1-3** were the first pass through slopewash, fill was very regular, some tumble exposed at bottom of pass in the eastern edge of trench. Area above and to east of wall **B3104** was not excavated with these pails. Pails **B3102.4-6** were a second pass over slopewash, continuing to expose rock tumble at bottom of pass in the eastern portions of trench, rock tumble exposed followed the slope of the hill. Pails **B3102.7-9** were a third pass over slopewash in entire trench area, continuing to expose tumble at bottom, proceeding westwards to a modern terrace wall, which was later removed. This pass exposed and defined the "stairway" in the southeastern corner of the trench, which was thought to be a wall at the time. Fill in this pail same as in previous passes over slopewash, regular mix of small stones and brown soil. Pail **B3102.10** was the beginning of a pass over what was identified as EIA packing in the northeastern corner of the trench. This pass was discontinued when it was decided that this area would be later excavated as a separate locus, only about ~1m x .5m of packing was removed. Pail **B3102.11** removed smaller tumble and slopewash in the area just to the west of the "stairway" in the southeast corner, this area was above what was later identified as stone "pavers." Pail **B3102.12** removed more slopewash in central and western portions of the trench and removed the modern terrace wall, which was the trench's western border. After its removal, trench expanded following the slope of the hill as excavation continued downwards. Pail **B3102.13** removed remaining slopewash on the western edge of the trench, however this pass was discontinued after it was decided we would first remove rock tumble in the eastern portion of the trench to facilitate soil removal. This pail exposed the top courses of wall **D310** in the western portion of the trench. Pails **B3103.1-3** were an initial pass over rock tumble in the eastern ~1/2 of the trench. Removal of this tumble exposed the top course of wall **B3104** and defined the "stairway" in the southeastern corner of the trench. Remains of what may have been the exterior ledge/platform in the southeastern portion of the trench were also exposed with this pass. Pails **B3103.4-5** were a second pass over rock tumble in the eastern ~1/2 of trench. These pails further defined the "stairway", "platform," and exposed the top of the "pavers" in the southeastern corner of the trench. This pass exposed the top course of wall **B3104** completely, and showed it to abut wall **D310** just east of the doorway. This pass also exposed the large vertical stone crossing doorway, possibly a threshold stone or tumble. This pass also continued to define wall **D310**, which was found to have a well-preserved door jamb, though the portion of the wall west of the door jamb appeared to have slipped. Pail **B3103.6** was the final pass over rock tumble in the eastern ~1/2 of the trench. This pail exposed the bedrock outcrop in the central portion of the trench, and the northern portion of a linear

accumulation of stones which was thought to be a western wall, and is now thought to be the remainder of wall **B3107** (slipped). Pail **B3103.8** defined the linear accumulation (remainder of wall **B3107** southward, removing soil and tumble from above and to west of it. Pail **B3103.9** removed chalky red "bedding" or eroded bedrock with well-preserved bone from to the west of and below the remainder of wall **B3107**. Excavation with this pail showed the linear accumulation did not continue downwards, and it was determined to be mostly tumble. This pail also defined the western portion of wall **D310**, several courses of which were exposed to area west of wall **B3107**. This pail was heavily included with well-preserved bone, particularly in the area just below the linear accumulation. Pail **B3103.10** was sweepings from all over trench. Pail **B3103.11** removed the remainder of wall **B3107**, which was identified as wall tumble. Removal of tumble with this pail exposed the relatively well-preserved portion of wall **B3107** remaining in the northern portion of the trench, wall was preserved ~1.5 meters from its abutment with wall **D310**. Pail **B3103.12** removed the last of the rock tumble in the north-central portion of the trench, this area of tumble remained to allow for a wheelbarrow path. In the northern ~1/2 of trench, in the area to north of the bedrock outcrop and to the east of wall **B3107**, grey roofing clay was exposed underneath tumble, embedded in places with isolated tumble stones. Erosion/habitation debris was mixed with roofing clay in this area. Pail **B3103.13** cleaned around the stone "pavers" in the southeastern corner of the trench, removing some tumble and soil including the area. Removal of tumble in central portion of the trench revealed a large bedrock outcrop extending ~2.5m west into trench, and measuring ~5m N-S. Removal of tumble with these pails showed wall **B3104**'s southern extent to be built upon bedrock. Bedrock in this area was not apparently modified. Pail **B3105.1** removed a mix of erosion/tumble/EIA packing from above and to east of wall **B3104** in an effort to isolate remaining EIA packing below and to east of this pail. Pail **B3105.2** removed packing/erosion/tumble from area between wall **B3111** and built feature to south of it to define the area and determine whether a southern continuation of wall **B3107** was preserved here. No wall was found, tumble removed could have been slipped portions of the feature which is preserved to south and thought to be a possible platform to the west of **B2200**. Pail **B3105.3** removed a few slipped stones from above the "stairway" in the southeastern corner of the trench, removal defined feature, though its identification as a stairway is still tentative. Pails **B3106.1-2** removed roofing clay / habitation debris from in and below eastern face of wall **B3104** to better define it. Central portion of the wall was found to be built on bedrock, northern portion of the wall is composed of a boulder abutting the eastern door jamb of **D300** southern doorway, no second course to northern end of the wall. The wall has only two courses preserved. Pails **B3106.3-4** were the initial pass over grey roofing clay in the northern portion of the trench, removal of which revealed what was left of the possibly exterior surface. The northeastern corner of the trench was not excavated with these pails due to a linear accumulation of stones in this area which was later found to be tumble. Pail **B3106.5** removed remaining roofing clay / habitation debris in the northeastern corner of the trench, linear accumulations which were thought to define a possible feature in this area were found to be wall tumble and were removed. Excavation with this pail exposed a relatively well-preserved surface in the northeastern corner of the trench. There were isolated patches of burning in this area, but no clear destruction layer. Surface revealed was preserved N-S from wall **D10** about

3-4m south of it, and E-W from wall **B3104** 3-4m to the west of it. The area just to the east of wall **B3107** was eroded, no surface preserved here and no clear roofing clay. Some tumble was removed from this area, exposing the eastern face of wall **B3107**, which was not well preserved. Pail **B3106.6** removed a large, horizontal, flat stone just to the southwest of doorway, this was previously thought to be a plaka, but was found to be floating ~5cm above the exposed surface. Some burning underneath plaka. Pail **B3106.7** removed some remaining high areas of soil underneath rock tumble from around bedrock outcrop. Soil was included with burn patches, but no distinct areas of roofing clay and no surface preserved here. Excavation of this pail revealed what looked to be a mix of bedding and erosion at bottom.

EIA structure:

Pail **B3108.1-3** were two passes removing EIA packing in the northeast corner of trench extension to east of wall **B3104**. Removal of packing in this area exposed no wall to north of pail area, exposed the top course of wall **B3109** on the eastern edge of pail. These passes brought the surface down to same level as portion of packing excavated in 2004. Pails **B3108.4-6** were an initial pass over entire trench extension area, this area defined to west by wall **B3104**, to east by walls **B3109** and **B3110**, to south by wall **B3111**, and to north by trench extension border following line of wall **D310**. Excavation removed what is thought to be packing used to fill the EIA structure exposed in this area. Excavation with these pails exposed the western face of wall **B3110**, the northern face of wall **B3111**, and the western face of wall **B3109**, of which only one course is preserved. Wall **B3109** was shown to be built upon a bedrock outcrop, the top of which was exposed with this pass. Bottom of pass revealed a mix of packing and rock tumble, possibly from earlier structure. Pails **B3108.7,9** were a pass through this mix of packing and rock tumble, exposing what looked to be erosion/habitation debris at bottom. These pails further defined walls to east and south of pail area. Pail **B3108.8** removed a hydria smashed by wall tumble which was exposed in the southeastern portion of pail **B3108.7** area. Pail **B3108.10** removed erosion/tumble from southern extent of wall **B3110** to determine whether wall continued south to abut wall **B3111**. Relatively regular stones or tumble exposed with this pail look to be a mix of tumble and possible portions of the wall, wall not preserved well in this area. Pails **B3112.1-2** removed erosion/habitation debris in the northeastern portion of trench extension, exposing a large bedrock outcrop extending down and westwards. Pails **B3112.3-4** removed erosion/habitation debris above a possible surface in the eastern extent of the trench extension area. Surface best defined in area between walls **B3110** and **B3104**. No preserved pottery scatters on surface, no burning. Excavation in this area showed surface exposed to be at slightly lower level than the top of wall **B3104**. Northern area of trench extension dominated by the bedrock outcrop and a small area of eroded soil between bedrock and wall **B3104**, Bedrock possibly modified as part of its incorporation into an EIA structure defined by walls **B3109**, **B3110**, and **B3111**.

Discussion:

The north-central portion of B3100 described to the north by wall **D310**, to the east by wall **B3104**, to the west by wall **B3107**, and to the south by central bedrock outcrop has not been clearly identified. It is thought wall **B3104** is a retaining wall holding back the EIA packing, which supported an Archaic (?) structure's surface to the northeast of B3100. The packing to the east of wall **B3104** fills the area between B3100's central area and the western wall of **B2200**. Wall **B3104** does not appear to be large enough to be the wall of a structure – it is only one course wide and built upon bedrock. This wall continues south to abut wall **B3111**, and it is thought the wall ended here originally, with the area to the south occupied by the “built feature” to the south of wall **B3111** and west of **B2200**. Wall **B3107** in the western edge of the trench likely serves a similar function as wall **B3104**, retaining the packing and surface of the area just south of doorway and to west of wall **B3104**. The linear accumulation removed to the south of the end of wall **B3107** likely represents the remainder of the wall, though most of it was obviously out of place. If this is the case, it suggests wall **B3107** continued southwards, but the original extent of the wall southwards is indeterminate. Interpretation of the surface just south of **D310** is difficult. Since walls **B3107** and **B3104** are likely retaining walls, the surface exposed is thought to be exterior space, possibly roofed, as suggested by the extent of roofing clay removed from above. The surface contained no features definitely identifiable as column bases, though any roofing supports in the area could have been resting on the ample bedrock outcrop in the central portion of the trench. Pottery from the surface suggests a late Archaic date, associating the area with the D300 structure to north and B2200 to the west.

The area to the south of the central bedrock outcrop did not appear to be well-preserved. In the southeastern corner of the trench, a higher area of built stones (some slipped) suggest some feature was present between the area to south of the bedrock outcrop and the western wall of B2200. A portion of this feature has been preserved; it has been speculated that the remaining portion of this feature represents risers which could have been a stairway leading from the southern edge of B3100 (containing an area of possible pavers, suggesting a roadway) eastwards into a speculative doorway in the west wall of B2200. To the north of this “stairway,” there are a few large, relatively regular flat stones elevated ~.5m above level of surface excavated in northern portion of the trench. This area may represent an exterior platform to the west of B2200's western wall, or it could be the remains of a northern continuation of the stairway to south.

The area west of wall **B3107** appeared to be washed out. Bedding removed from underneath the wall contained well-preserved bone, loom weights, and stone tools. No architecture was revealed to the west of wall **B3107**, no surfaces revealed. Western edge of the trench is a mix of topsoil, tumble, and slopewash.

The northeastern trench extension of **B3100** explored the remains of what is thought to be an EIA structure underlying **B2200** to east and **D400** to north. Walls **B3109**, **B3110**, and **B3111** are thought to be associated with the EIA structure. Excavation of the “EIA packing” above and to the east of wall **B3104** revealed a mix of pottery in its uppermost

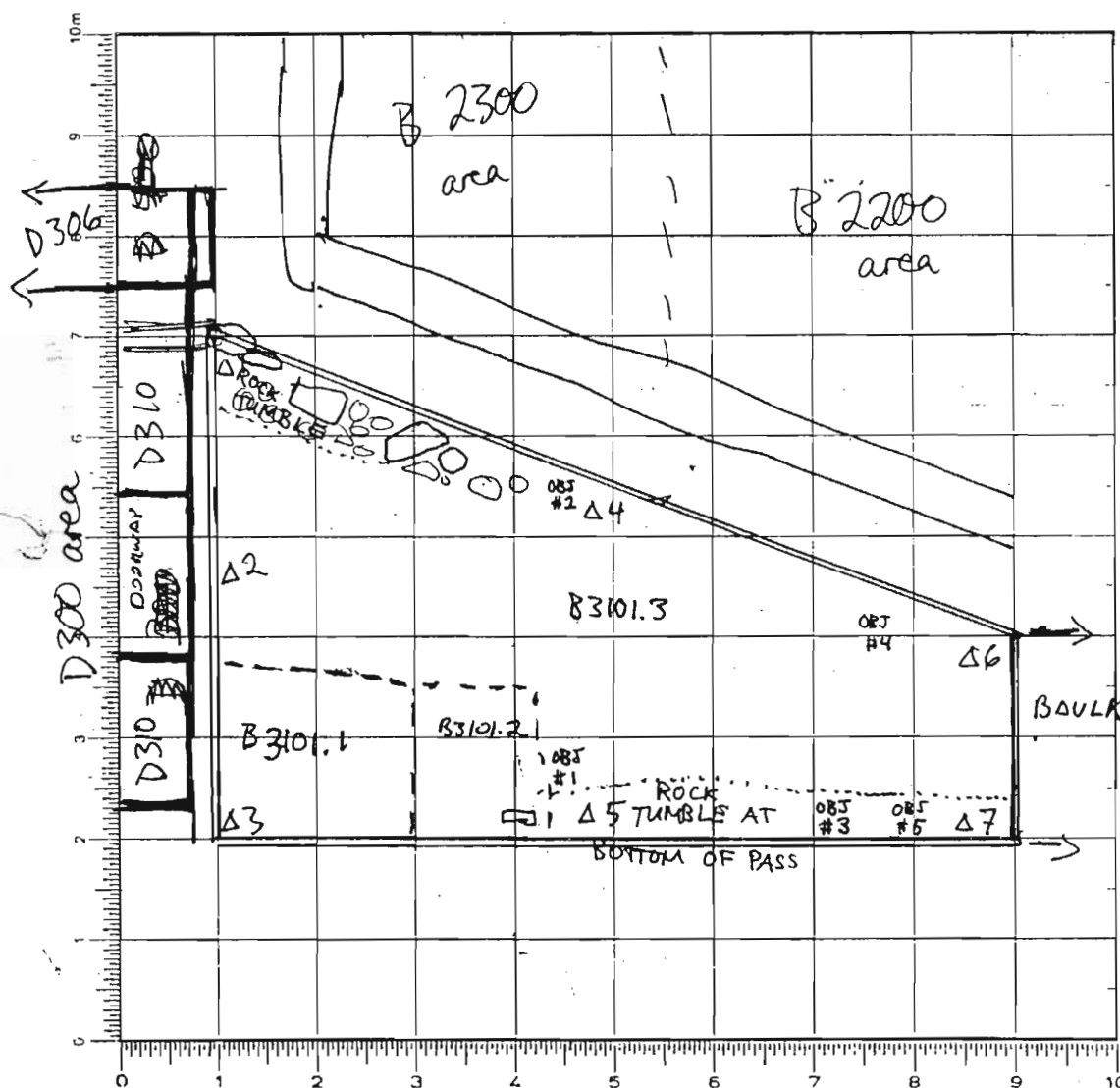
layers, lower layers of pottery have not been read yet. It is thought the packing in this area filled the EIA structure to build a surface for the Archaic corner preserved in trench **D400**. If this is the case, retaining wall **B3104** would have been constructed at the same time the packing was put into place. Excavation in the area showed walls **B3110** and **B3111** to be preserved to at least two courses. In the northern portion of the trench extension, wall **B3109** was found to be built upon or floating above bedrock below. Bedrock outcrop in the northern portion of trench extension has a small flat area which may contain a surface (a potstand?). Bottom portion of bedrock has two edges that may have been cut back to facilitate its incorporation into the EIA structure. Excavation did not completely define the EIA structure architecturally; wall **B3109** appears to continue northwards. West of wall **B3104**, there appear to be no remains of the EIA structure. Confirmation of the identification of the structure in northeastern trench extension as an EIA structure will not be possible until pottery is dated. It appears the EIA structure continued westward past what is now wall **B3104**, suggested by the possibility that wall **B3111** continued westward over bedrock outcrop.
