
Trench *B1300* was opened on 25 June 03 by SZP to the south of *B600* and the west of *B1100* on the south slope of the hill. The trench measures 3.72m on the N, 5.26m on the E, 4.85m on the S, and 4.82m on the W. Large, worked bedrock boulders bound the NW quadrant of the trench. Students (Anne Sassin, Abbie Bollans, and Erika Zimmermann) and workmen (Yiannis and Pandalis) helped clear this trench with SZP, but when excavation began with KK there were different students (Jay Smith, Jordan Saunders, and Eric Griffin) and workmen (Matina Soliadakis, Manolis Maniadakis, and Georgos Kanitakis).

This trench consists of a room as defined by the southern and western worked bedrock walls and a northern composite wall which was excavated as part of trench B1100 (locus B1107). The floor of the room is locus B1304, which consisted of yellowish packed soil. No roofing material was found in excavation, and our section below the floor with locus B1306 produced a loom weight and solely Archaic pottery before bedrock was found about 8cm below B1304. Whereas it is fairly certain that the floor dates to Archaic times, it is unclear when the bin feature of locus B1305 was built. The workmanship of the stone suggests some rocks were reused from their original purpose and hastily built into some sort of bin or other retaining structure in the eastern part of the trench, abutting the eastern bedrock wall. The bin measures almost 2m long and 0.75m wide with a depth of 0.4m. No artifacts at all came from the soil inside the feature. Also questionable in date is north wall B1107. This wall was excavated as part of trench B1100, but it is possible that stones from this wall were reused to face the northern wall of the room described by trench B1300. Directly adjacent to the eroded, composite bedrock bedding of wall B1107 is a row of worked stones to the south. It is unlikely these stones fell into a straight line, but they rest very oddly on the floor surface of B1304. Perhaps in later use of the room, tumbled boulders from B1107 were used to create a new face for the northern wall of

The remaining loci were clearing passes. B1303 was the locus of smaller tumble on top of the floor surface, probably created by deposition from wall B1107 and from stones higher up the south slope of the hill. Locus B1302 consisted of medium to large tumble throughout the trench, and most of this locus was removed with large picks. It is likely the tumble in this locus also came from the northern wall B1107 and from other walls uphill. Finally, locus B1301 included some very small stones, but was taken as a pass for clearing topsoil and removing modern wheelbarrow paths from the trench. Excavation lasted until 2 July 03, with a section taken through the floor on 10 July 03. Final sections of B1300 and B1107 (northern side) were completed on 14 July 03.

Trench B1300 is the southernmost room in a multi-room house that extends northward to include the two rooms in trench B1100. This room was initially used in the Archaic period, as evidenced by the pottery on and beneath the floor. However, the built feature of B1305 and the possible reuse of stones from B1107 indicate that, at a later date—possibly in Hellenistic times—the room was again inhabited. There is a fairly clear doorway in B1107 that would allow entrance and egress between B1300 and the southern room of B1100. Whether there was a main entrance to the house in B1300 is unclear. The southern portion of the trench is bounded by worked bedrock, and the eastern portion is greatly eroded. No main entrance has been found in B1100 either, though, so it is unclear whether B1300 is the back or the front of the house.


