FINAL REPORT FOR A800 MSE 14 July 2003


A800 is located south of A1100, north of A1900, east of A600, and west of A100. The room/andreion was excavated in 2002, but the exact location of the back/east wall (A808) remained unclear, due to the extensive slippage/tumble of stones. Excavations were conducted this season only in and behind the projected area of that wall, which is located between walls A807 and A812. The size of the area excavated was ~3.65 x 1.20 m.

The workmen for this trench were Bangelis Phiorakis, Stelios Koutsakis, Demetrios Chalchiadakis, and Nikos Kophinakis. The trench assistants were Sarah Levin Richardson, Emily Anderson, and Stephanie Beach and the trench supervisor was Melissa Eaby. Excavations were conducted from 27 June - 2 July 2003. The benchmarks used were R1 (+370.62 m.) and R4 (+365.74 m.).

The strata for the excavated area were: pure wall tumble and wall tumble mixed with roofing clay (A822=A802; 805; 806; 809) and pure roofing clay (A824.1-2=A813), which came down on the poorly preserved floor surface mixed with pre-bedrock (A824.3=A813.3; 815). Wall tumble passes (A822.1-3) included moderate amounts of bone and Archaic, Hellenistic, and LM IIIC pottery, while A822.4 contained bone and Archaic pottery. A pair of agrimi horns was found near the NE corner in cleaning with pass A822.3. In addition, pure roofing clay passes included a loomweight and possible stone tool, together with only small amounts of Archaic pottery and bone.

Excavation revealed the actual back/east wall of the building, A823, together with the packing behind it (bottom of A822.2). Cross-walls A807 and 812 both appear to abut this wall. A823 seems to be the original back wall of this room, extending down to the floor/pre-bedrock. This wall likely continues into A1100 and joins up with the extension of A821, the original archaic cross-wall of the building. It may also continue into A1900, though this is currently unclear. No other trace of the previously identified possible Hellenistic floor (A 810) was found; it appears to have been merely a patch of ceiling clay mixed in with the tumble. Thus wall A807, previously identified as Hellenistic, may actually be earlier, possibly reflecting later Archaic changes to this building, and Hellenistic activity in the area may have been restricted primarily to an extensive terracing of this part of the hill, as observed in A1900, possibly for buildings on the summit of the hill.

This season's brief excavations thus do not appear to contribute to the interpretation of this building as an andreion. One interesting point to note is that the large boulder/bedrock found imbedded in the floor is located nearly exactly 2 meters out from wall A823, and may have served some function in the room, rather than merely having fallen in at a later date. Excavation in this area most significantly brings into question the exact nature of Hellenistic activity in this area of the site.


