This year marks the construction and dedication of the ninth "Hands for Habitat" home. This home, located in Hillsborough, was surrounded by the homebuyer family, donors, partners, and some very special volunteers at the dedication ceremony on May 11.

"Hands for Habitat" is a unique program where students in the Construction Trades program at Orange High School come to the Habitat jobsite to build a home as part of their coursework. The students spend their first and second class periods throughout the year building the home from the ground up.

At the beginning of this year, the partnership was in danger of disbanding when a previous partner was unable to provide funding. Thankfully, PHE, Inc., a Hillsborough-based company, was moved by the students' passion and the Habitat model and stepped up without hesitation to sponsor the home at the \$50,000 level.

"We are very excited to be a part of this partnership with Habitat," said Katy Zvolerin, Director of Public Relations at PHE, Inc., during the May 11 dedication. "Our staff keeps asking when we can do this again and build another house!"

In May, Judea Reform Congregation and the Levin Jewish Community Center partnered with Habitat to host a build day for people of *all abilities* and their family and friends, to participate in the Habitat mission of building stability for our neighbors.

Every summer throughout my childhood, my parents would wake us up in the middle of the night, and we would leave our home to drive the 1,000 miles to my grandparents' house. I cherish my wonderful and vivid memories of those visits.

What books on your shelf are begging to be read?

I have a book called Radical Acceptance by Tara Brach that is calling to me right now. In general, though, I love to read novels, and I just finished a really good one called Americanah by Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie.

What skill would you like to master?

I'm not sure if this is a skill, or has more to do with an innate ability, but I have always admired really persuasive and eloquent public speakers.

What is your favorite memory of working with Habitat?

Home dedications are my favorite events; you get to experience the joy felt by homebuyers who are realizing their dream of owning their own home, along with the comradery and shared effort among all of the partners that helped build the home.

What was the best news you ever received?

The call saying I was being offered the position of the first Executive Director of Habitat in Orange County. I really didn't know what I was getting into, but I knew that it was the right place for me to be at the right time in my life and the life of the organization.

What is your favorite memory of your first home?

The first home I really remember was a small three-bedroom ranch, very similar to the homes we build, that I lived in with my parents and three siblings. What I liked best was that my best friends lived close by and I could walk or ride my bike to their homes. Home was a place where my friends were welcome, and where I felt secure and loved.
