THE CHANCELLOR'S MEDALLION

After taking the oath of office, Holden Thorp will receive the Chancellor's Medallion from University of North Carolina President Erskine Bowles. The three-inch diameter medallion is made of sterling silver, and bears the University seal on the obverse.

Donated by John Sanders, professor emeritus and former director of the University's Institute of Government, the medallion was modeled by Pittsboro sculptor Pete Hinton.
