#### **Tribal Elections**

On Saturday, June 9, 2018, we will hold our Tribal Elections. Come out and cast your vote. The elections will be held at the Chief W.R. Richardson Tribal Complex Government Complex. The polls will open at 7:00 a.m. and will close at 7:00 p.m. You must be an enrolled tribal member and 16 and older to vote. Please turn off your cell phones when you enter the building. Any markings other than selections will be considered a defaced ballot and will not be counted. No campaigning will be allowed on the sidewalk, parking lot, or lawn adjacent to the building. Campaigning is allowed only on the lawn opposite the parking lot. No pets allowed unless it's a service animal. Curbside assistance is available for handicapped and disabled. (Please blow your horn)

### The 2018 Citizens Academy

The FBI is interested in selecting candidates who represent a diverse cross section of the community and who will continue their involvement after graduation by considering joining the FBI Citizen's Academy Alumni Association. The course is scheduled to take place September 19, 2018 through November 7, 2018. Academy sessions will be held at Wake Technical Community College, Public Safety Education Campus on Wednesday evenings from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. There will also be a Saturday morning firearms and SWAT demonstration on November 3, 2018 (Oak Grove Technologies, 158 Rushing Road, Hoffman, NC). The final event will be a graduation ceremony at a local restaurant on Wednesday, November 7, 2018. The deadline to apply is July 13, 2018. The Citizens Academy is an engaging eight-week program that gives business, religious, civic, and community leaders an inside look at the FBI. The mission of the FBI Citizens Academy is to foster a greater understanding of the role of federal law enforcement in the community through frank discussion and education. Candidates are self-nominated and nominated by FBI employees, former Citizens Academy graduates, and community leaders.
