## Construction is officially underway on Crescent Magnolia in Hillsborough



A 24-townhome community designed for seniors ages 55 and up.

The first 11 Crescent Magnolia homebuyers have been selected and approved, and were working on their sweat equity months ahead of construction beginning on their own homes. These homes are part of Habitat's next development in Hillsborough, a 24-townhome community designed for seniors ages 55 and up. On September 8, Habitat celebrated the official kickoff of the development on the construction site. Attendees included Town and County elected officials, financial sponsors, neighbors, future residents, and community partners.

Anne Marie spoke about her experience so far as a Habitat homebuyer, earning sweat equity hours by volunteering at The Little School childcare center right next to Crescent Magnolia, and working for UNC Health Care, a financial sponsor of the project.

"The rent at my apartment keeps increasing, which is pushing out the core community," she said in a pervious interview. "This program is great for creating security and building a community that can support each other. This is also a chance for me to settle in and have a place to live in until I die without wondering if my rent will ever increase." Anne Marie stands on the lot that her home will be built on.

### Home rescued and restored in collaboration with Orange County

abitat's Home Preservation program completes a wide variety of repairs. Projects can range in scope from a new coat of exterior paint, to something much larger. In August, Habitat wrapped up a project that was over a year in the making.

The Orange County Sportsplex in Hillsborough was ready to expand its facilities, and a home located on its land was scheduled for demolition. Orange County staff contacted Habitat about the possibility of moving the home instead, saving it from the landfill.

On a cold December day, the home was carefully loaded up and driven across town; the journey of less than five miles took over eight hours. Finally, the home was placed onto its new lot in the Fairview neighborhood, right next door to the Habitat home completed by Orange High School construction students in May.

Habitat worked throughout the year to make needed repairs and updates to the home. Work included laying a new foundation, upgrading the electrical systems, and removing lead paint from the exterior. Additional features were added to ensure that the homebuyers will be able to age in place, including a ramp and an accessible bathroom.

In late August, the home was finally move-in ready, and the family received the keys during a dedication ceremony. Ed Kuczynski, Habitat's Home Preservation Manager, spent many hours hard at work on this project. "Service comes in many forms," he said at the dedication. "Continue to do service and give back in as many ways as you can."
