Gayest cities crowned

Minneapolis may be suffering subzero temperatures and the departure of Brett Favre, but it has one reason to celebrate: It's the gayest city in America.

The city took the top spot in an annual poll by the Advocate, a national gay news magazine. Last year's winner, Atlanta, plummeted to seventh place.

Criteria for the rankings included a city's number of gay elected officials, gay-friendly religious congregations and gay.com profiles.

Rounding out the top five were Santa Fe, N.M., Las Vegas, Orlando, Fla., and Pittsburgh.
