The 105th Annual Session of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists May 24, 2017

"Growing in Grace Through Networking" II Corinthians 9:8-9

The 105th Session of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists opened with a worship service. Praise and worship singing was led by the Rev. Stephen Prescott. Mr. Tom Casey served as Convention Pianist.

The Convention business session was called to order by Teresa Eason, Convention Secretary.

The Reverend Ronnie Hobgood, Convention President, introduced an agenda change and requested that proposed Constitutional changes be read by the Secretary. Motion was made, seconded, and passed for proposed changes to be laid on the table.

President Hobgood offered greetings and remarks related to our theme of *Growing in Grace Through Networking*. He challenged all to create a network of happenings in our local churches and share with one another ideas that will reach people for the kingdom of God, including millennials and future generations. President Hobgood led in an opening prayer.

Dr. Philip Kerstetter, President of the University of Mount Olive, delivered greetings and welcoming remarks to all in attendance. He introduced Dr. John Blackwell and Jessica Sellers for remarks regarding *The Challenge: Exploring God's Call*, a program for youth to develop leadership. Ms. Sellers brought remarks concerning her participation in *The Challenge* and encouraged churches to send their youth to participate as well.

President Hobgood recognized and welcomed special guests in attendance.

The Convention Executive Committee Report was presented for information during the morning session. In an effort to provide time for delegates to read the minutes, motion for approval was postponed until the afternoon session.

The Convention Treasurer's Report was given for information.

The Nominating Committee Report was given by Dr. Sam Weeks. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept this report. Opportunity to place others into nomination will be considered in the afternoon session.

Necessary business was conducted with an initial report of the Credentials Committee.

The Secretary presented a second reading of the proposed Constitutional changes.

The Rev. Josh Whitfield, Convention Vice President, moderated the business session at this point. Reports and Recommendations from the OFWB Ministries were begun with conclusion during the afternoon session. The following reports were given during the morning session: Children's Home, Church Finance Association (reported for information as no motion is required), Ministers' Program, Cragmont Assembly, Foreign Missions, FWB Press, Camp Vandemere, Retirement Homes, Christian Education Ministry, and The University of Mount Olive

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to recess for break.

Following break, the morning worship service convened with singing led by Rev. Stephen Prescott, accompanied by Mr. Tom Casey. Special music was provided by the Prescott Family. President Hobgood introduced Dr. Mike Cogdill, Founding Dean and Professor of the Campbell University Divinity School, who delivered an inspiring message of encouragement for moving forward as God's people.

Following lunch, President Hobgood called the meeting back to order. The Rev. De Eakes led in prayer.

Vice President Whitfield called for the conclusion of the Ministry Reports as follows: Woman's Auxiliary, NC Foundation for Christian Ministries, Historical Commission, Commission on Christian Education, Youth Convention, Chaplain's Commission, and Carolina Bible Institute. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the Ministry Reports and Recommendations.

President Hobgood resumed the role of moderator.

The P. T. Lucas Ministerial Awards for Ministry were presented by Rev. Bryant Hines representing the Minister's Association.

- The award for full-time Minister of the Year was presented to Rev. Roger Haithcock, Pastor of Rose Hill Free Will Baptist Church.
- The award for bi-vocational Minister of the Year was presented to Rev. Jeff Daughtry, Pastor of May's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church.

President Hobgood introduced an Update on Home Missions and Evangelism. He summarized the steps taken in responding to the 2016 motion, along with those steps in securing professional guidance through a CPA and tax attorney. Rev. Josh Whitfield, Chair of the Sub-Committee, presented the Convention Update in addition to the two letters of update previously sent out. The floor was opened for questions to the Executive Committee related to the Home Missions update. No questions were asked. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept this partial report and update.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the recommendation of the Executive Committee to suspend the Board of Home Missions and Evangelism with the Convention Executive Committee acting as said Board until work entrusted to us by the 2016 Convention is completed.

Mr. Gary Barefoot gave the Memorial Committee Report for information.

The Rev. Leon Grubbs reported that there were no resolutions to be presented to the 2017 Convention. He did extend appreciation to the University of Mount Olive for hosting the Convention.

Nominations from the floor were opened for Officers, Boards, and Committees. A nomination was made for Rev. Tony Parrish to serve as the Piedmont Conference representative to the Executive Committee. Motion was made, seconded, and passed, to accept this nomination.

No other motions from the floor were made. Motion was made seconded and passed to accept all those entered into nomination.

The Final Report of the Credentials Committee was given for information. Ministers-230, Delegates-212, Vistors-45 for a total of 487 in attendance. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to adopt the Credentials Committee Report.

Being individually considered, motions were made, seconded, and passed to adopt each proposed Constitutional Change.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to adopt the Executive Committee Report.

In other business, Rev. Dr. Ricky Warren commended the work of the Executive Committee during the preceding year. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to give a standing vote of confidence to the Executive Committee for the work done over the course of the year.

Rev. John Hill was recognized for a question as to whether the Executive Committee will seek legal remedy if the Financial Audit turns up illegal activity. President Hobgood reported that decision has not been made, as we continue to seek reports to complete the work entrusted to us.

Interim Director, Gary Bailey, made announcements, including encouragement to attend the night's *Call to Missions* at 7:00 pm where Rev. Owen Barrow will deliver a message with an emphasis on planting churches.

Installation of Officers, Boards, and Committees took place with Rev. Gary Bailey offering a prayer of dedication.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed that all unfinished business be left with the Executive Committee.

President Ronnie Hobgood concluded the 105th Session of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists with a prayer of benediction.

Executive Committee June 6, 2017 Convention Services

President, Ronnie Hobgood welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order. Attending, in addition to President Hobgood, were Teresa Eason-Secretary, Barbara Lancaster-Treasurer, Mark Hobbs, Tony Parrish, Linwood Smith, Lynn Paul, Justin Barnett, Aubrey Williamson, and Interim Convention Services Director, Gary Bailey. Gary Bailey read Psalm 27 and led the group in prayer.

President Hobgood reminded all that as we provide information to our conferences and churches we are able to discuss and share only information in which action is taken by motion.

Minutes of the previous meeting were presented by Teresa Eason and accepted by motion.

Feedback on the 2017 Convention was discussed, including positive response to the one-day convention, as well as suggestions for improvement. The Eastern Conference requests that our minutes reflect that their minutes were sent to the Press but were not in the 2017 Report Book. Gary Bailey will look into how we charge the conferences and ministries for the report book.

The written report on Home Missions and Evangelism given to the Convention will stand as presented. President Hobgood has appointed Josh Whitfield, Aubrey Williamson, and Franklin Baggett to talk with Jose Perez about the Hispanic ministries and create policies for operation. The Sub-Committee on Home Missions and Evangelism will be discontinued. President Hobgood provided an update on bills paid. He will be working on naming a sub-committee with representation from all ages to compile suggestions for moving forward with Home Missions.

The convention theme: Growing in Grace through Networking and ideas for networking were discussed for the coming year.

The Executive Committee went into executive session to consider an employment item of business.

The Executive Committee reconvened in open session. Linwood Smith reported the unanimous decision to extend the offer to Gary Bailey to fill the position of Director of Convention Services, on a part-time basis as he served while in an interim capacity. Gary has accepted the position.

Gary Bailey provided an update on the Mark Lowry concert plans including sponsorships and ticket sales. He will be calling on us for assistance as needed.

President Hobgood reported that he will appoint a group to begin the process of having the Free Will Baptist Press become a denominational ministry based on normal convention protocol.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to adjourn.

Executive Committee Meeting August 22, 2017

Convention Services

President, Ronnie Hobgood welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order. Attending, in addition to President Hobgood, were Teresa Eason-Secretary, Barbara Lancaster-Treasurer, Mark Hobbs, Tony Parrish, Buddy Seay, Linwood Smith, Aubrey Williamson, and Convention Services Director, Gary Bailey. Buddy Seay read Isaiah 40:28-31 and led in prayer.

By motion, minutes of the June meeting and minutes of the 2017 Convention were approved as presented.

President Hobgood asked that ideas for Growing in Grace through Networking be sent to him.

President Hobgood provided an update on the 2016 Resolution 1 Independent Committee membership. He is waiting for a response from potential members. Danny Daniels will chair the Independent Committee. Once 3 members are secured, they can begin work on the resolution, and secure other members of the committee.

The 2017 Mark Lowry Concert was discussed, including feedback and suggestions. The concert cleared \$13,376.18. It was noted that Mark Lowry is trying to put together a Christmas program for 2018 and we are on the top of the list as a possible host. Gary Bailey would like to consider 2 events, one possibly focusing on a younger group. Possible 2018 concert acts were discussed.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the financial report.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to place \$10,000 into a savings account with Church Finance.

Reports from the Denominational Ministries of Christian Education, Children's Home, and the University of Mount Olive were received.

Gary Bailey provided the Convention Services Director Report, including plans for a meeting on September 12 with pastors age 40 and under. He has looked into improving and updating our webpage. He has received a price of \$1,223 to host our site for 3 years. Motion was made seconded and passed to improve our website at an expense not to exceed this amount, thereby giving Gary the flexibility to explore providers. Gary is also exploring a texting service to be able to send group texts rather than emails. He will talk with the young pastors for suggestions on 9/12.

Closed Session

The Executive Committee entered into closed session to discuss a personnel matter.

Open Session

In open session, Linwood Smith reported that the Executive Committee wholly supports the work Convention Services Director, Gary Bailey is doing and there will be no adjustment in pay if he has to take some extra time off in caring for his wife, Kristie. President Hobgood shared a request from Kaye Chandler to transfer the deed to the Powel-Heath Family Cemetery back to her. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to transfer the deed to Kaye Chandler.

President Hobgood provided an update on Home Missions regarding taxes and bills paid to date. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to allow Josh Whitfield to move forward with a CPA from Mount Olive to bring payments to the NCDOR up to date.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to have the Morehead City and Landis properties appraised.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to allow Josh Whitfield to move the Home Missions bank account to a bank in Mount Olive.

Jose Perez will be asked to meet with us on September 7 and report on the work he is doing with the Hispanic Ministry. We should also consider on September 7 what direction we want to take for the Hispanic Ministry.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to negotiate an agreement with the Convention Services office for Home Missions to occupy office space in the Mount Olive office.

Jeff Hale, CPA, will be asked to submit a written report of findings on Home Missions.

President Hobgood has appointed the Executive Committee Officers to serve as the 2018 Convention Planning Committee and bring recommendations to the full Executive Committee.

Next meeting: September 7, 2017, 9:00, Convention Services Office, to discuss our plan for Home Missions.

The meeting was adjourned with Mark Hobbs leading in prayer.

President Hobgood read Matthew 16:13-19 and led in prayer.

We reviewed a written report submitted by Jose Perez with Hispanic ministries and prepared questions for Mr. Perez. We then met with Mr. Perez, giving him time to go through the report with us and answer questions we have regarding his role when he visits mission works, the people he has in charge of the mission points, and ordination options for the superintendents of the mission points.

Following our meeting with Mr. Perez, his continued employment was discussed. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to terminate the employment of Jose Perez and pay him for 90 days.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to contact the Eastern and Albemarle conferences to request that they bring the Aurora mission point and the Monte Sinai OFWB Mission, respectively, under conference supervision.

Note: The La Gloria De Dios Mission is not in agreement with following the Original Free Will Baptists Articles of Faith.

In discussing the future vision for Home Missions, we brainstormed a number of ideas, including:

- The need for vision and mission statements.
- Exploring other mission plans, e.g. Methodist
- Planting new churches
- Revitalizing established churches
- Need to promote missions
- Sending notice to churches to make us aware of interest in planting a church
- Employing an interim Director of Home Missions and Evangelism
- Need for basic secretarial assistance for Home Missions
- A goal of naming a new board by the 2018 Convention

We also discussed the future of Hispanic Ministries and the Biker Ministry. It was noted as a reminder that the only funding source for the Biker Ministry are those contributions designated for that ministry; no other financial support comes from the Home Missions and Evangelism budget.

In old business, President Hobgood reported that the transfer of the Heath-Powel cemetery deed is in process and will be transferred to Kaye Chandler who will be paying all associated expenses for deed transfer.

President Hobgood provided an update on the 2016 Resolution 1 Independent Committee. Danny Daniels will chair the committee; Clifton Hardison, and Vernie Fountain have also agreed to serve. They will seek 2 more members and begin their work as charged in Resolution 1.

The financial report was presented. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the financial report.

Howard Scott, Vice Chairman of the UMO Presidential Search Committee, provided an update, sharing the prospectus provided to applicants and potential candidates. Academic Search has been contracted to consult with the Search Committee on the process. The criteria being used in the selection process was reviewed.

Marci Rollins-Smart, Chair of the Commission on Education for Christian Ministries, provided an update on the *Journeying Together* certificate program for lay leaders and church staff.

Al Warwick with the Ministerial Association presented a proposal to begin a *New Minister Leadership Institute* of training opportunities primarily for ministers having served 5 years or less. Financial support in the amount \$20,000 to \$25,000 will need to be secured.

President Hobgood reported on the status of Home Missions. We have been assigned a new consultant with the NCDOR who has informed us that we are up to date with the NCDOR. Jeff Hale, CPA has informed us that a full audit cannot be conducted given the condition of the books, i.e. lack of receipts and accounting, checks written to cash with no documentation, seemingly excessive amounts spent on food and gas without supporting documentation. Questions regarding payment of payroll taxes to the IRS will be addressed with Amy Wells, tax attorney.

No new updates from the Albemarle and Eastern Conferences with regard to taking over the Aurora and Monte Sinai mission points was available.

The Biker Ministry and Home Missions checking accounts will be opened at Southern Bank in Mount Olive. The account at Little Bank will remain open until all tax payments are made. President Hobgood reported balances for Home Missions accounts at this time. We are up to date with payments to Church Finance. Our goal is to be debt-free as the Home Missions ministry takes a new direction.

Gary Bailey presented a standard contract between Convention Services and Home Missions for office space at the Convention Services office one day per week. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to contract for space one day per week.

Gary Bailey presented the Convention Services Director report. April Goff has given 2-week notice that she will be leaving her position as Administrative Assistant. Gary Bailey and the Human Resources committee will advertise the position and will work together to fill the position.

Rev. Bailey reported on the meeting with ministers age 40 and under. Scott Satterfield will chair that group going forward.

Regarding the request of the Free Will Baptist Press and Board election, they will need to follow regular convention protocol for all denominational ministries.

Gary Bailey presented three quotes regarding the purchase of a new HVAC unit for the Convention Services office. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to purchase the Daikin 10 Ton Heat Pump from Anderson Heating and Cooling, Inc at a cost of \$10,460.00

Plans to update the Convention website will proceed.

Reports from liaisons to denominational ministries were given as follows: Lynn Paul-Albemarle Youth Convention and State Youth Convention; Tony Parrish-Retirement Home, Mark Hobbs-The Free Will Baptist Press

Reports from those attending Conference meetings were received as information.

In other business:

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to delay transferring \$10,000 into the savings account until a later date.

Gary Bailey reported that he has been exploring potential performers for the Summer 2018 concert. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to secure Karen Peck and New River for the Summer 2018 Concert at a cost of \$5,000. He will explore other acts as well.

Mission Statement For Church Finance Association

Church Finance serves as a conduit between those institutions and individuals who are willing to place funds with the Association and those institutions which are in need of these resources.

Is Your Church Willing to Help Other Churches?

Many of our churches have special use funds for building, contingencies, remodeling, or some type of emergency. The CFA urges our churches to take advantage of deposit program available through Church Finance. Your deposits are available for withdrawal within a few days. If you have funds in CDs or bank savings accounts, please consider making those available to your sister churches by placing them with the Church Finance Association. The Year in Review

Over the last year we have seen interest rates begin to rise slightly and the forecast for 2017 calls for rates to continue to increase slowly. Church Finance is lending at rates comparable to banks and credit unions. Loan demand continues to increase, and we are delighted to partner with our churches as they explore plans to expand their facilities.

Lending Activity

Church Finance has been around since 1940 to assist our churches when they needed to buy or build. We have funded small loans as well as loans up to \$1,000,000. Our goal has always been to partner with our churches in good times and bad. Church Finance has never foreclosed on a single loan and not one person or church has ever lost a dime when working with CFA.

We would like to encourage our churches that when a building program is discussed they give CFA an opportunity to discuss lending options with them. While we were not created to compete with the banks, we can often provide benefits that a bank cannot. If your church has a vision or a need that will involve a loan, we ask that you contact us. At the very least we can provide you another option assuring you that whatever decision you make is right for your church.

Will You Be A Part?

Regardless of whether you are an individual, auxiliary, or church you can be a part of this ministry. We need:

- Your **prayers.** Please remember the work of the Association in your prayers. Our goal continues to be helping each of our churches and ministries with their financial needs.
- Your **deposits.** We accept deposits from individuals, auxiliaries and churches. Please consider placing funds with us. We offer several options. Please call for rates.



2018 CONVENTION REPORT

Greetings from OFWB INTERNATIONAL, INC. (Foreign Missions) to the 106th Annual Session of the Convention of the Original Free Will Baptists.

Two thousand seventeen was the year in which we had to evaluate the direction of our work, as we adapt to a more dangerous world than we have ever known. This new reality means that travel to certain areas must be restricted. We had to cancel our Short-Term Mission Teams to Mexico in 2017 due to the continued violence there. We have done the same thing for 2018. We pray that the day will come when we will be able to resume this ministry. We miss going to Mexico and our brothers and sisters there miss us. The workers remain faithful and committed even under these circumstances. Please join us in prayer for peace in Mexico.

The work in Liberia and Guinea is thriving. The churches and schools are growing. Caleb's Dollar Ministry blesses the lives of over 1,400 children each school day with a noon meal. We sincerely appreciate the Vacation Bible School offerings that help fund this ministry, as well as Sunday school classes, individuals, and churches. The church in Guinea suffers through much persecution, but the workers remain determined to continue proclaiming the Gospel. Please pray for the work in Liberia and Guinea.

The Philippines continues to be a great encouragement. We have many dedicated workers all over the country. The churches are growing. New converts are coming into the churches. The schools are reaching children and youth with good education and the Gospel of Christ. The Annual Convention was held in Palawan in April 2017. Workers from all over the country attended. For many, this was their first trip to Palawan. They were excited because this is where Free Will Baptist work in the Philippines began. The Convention in 2018 was held in Cebu City. Please pray for the work in the Philippines.

The work in India has encountered many difficulties over the past year. There has been a financial crisis that hurt every sector of the country. A new pro-Hindi government, with bias against Christians, has made it more difficult for our workers. There have been other problems that have hindered the work. We, however, believe that the Lord is able to move His work forward in the midst of difficulty. The Children's Home and schools still care for and reach children with the Gospel. We pray for a brighter day to come to India, when that nation will fully realize the wonderful Truth of the Gospel and its liberating power from idol worship and darkness. Pray for India.

Bangladesh is a land of one hundred forty million people, mainly Muslim. A small group of Hindu and Christian people live in this country. The government discourages mission work but encourages relief and development. We are involved in many programs that reach people through

aid that gives us an opportunity to witness to them. This country is also a hot-bed of terrorism, and travel there is also restricted. Please pray for Bangladesh.

Our workers in Bulgaria stay busy ministering to the Gypsy community in Varna, Balchik, and the surrounding areas. These people are some of the neediest people in the entire world. They have acquired a bad reputation over the years, but when they come to Christ they make loving and caring Christians who are willing to serve others. Through the outreach of our church, we provide food, clothing, medicine, and other necessities for these dear people, especially during the cold months when work is scarce. We are reminded that when we care for one of the needy ones we are actually caring for Christ.

For the past three years we have been in the process of registering the work in Haiti under the name "Original Free Will Baptist International, Inc." This was a long and difficult process, but it has finally been completed. We are thankful that the Lord was faithful in this matter. We hope that in the years to come we can see the work expanded beyond the city of Cap-Haitian. This is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere, with great unemployment and despair. The Gospel Message is needed to give "Hope" for the future. Please pray for Haiti.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL PROJECT REPORT AND 2017 PROJECT: We asked the

Vacation Bible Schools to contribute their offerings to Caleb's Dollar Ministry to feed the children we minister to on our fields. One dollar will provide 10 meals. That is only 10 cents a meal. Many of the children who attend our schools come to school each day hungry. They cannot learn if they are hungry. Many of the Vacation Bible Schools contributed to this project in 2017, and we are feeding 1,407 children per day in Liberia with these contributions. Please help us continue feeding the children by contributing your Vacation Bible School offering to Caleb's Dollar Ministry for 2018. This must be an ongoing project, for if we stop hunger returns. This needs to be above and beyond your regular missions giving.

The <u>OFWBI EPISTLE</u> and <u>COMMUNITY MAGAZINE</u> are published to keep our membership informed about the activities of our ministries. These are your best sources for information about the things that are taking place in India, Bangladesh, Bulgaria, Mexico, Liberia, Guinea, Haiti, and the Philippines. We encourage you to send us your email address to <u>director@ofwbi.org</u> so you can receive the *OFWBI EPISTLE*.

The <u>BUILD ONE FOR THEM</u> program has been a tremendous blessing to all of our fields. We have been able to construct church buildings, parsonages, and houses for the needy. We need churches to consider the needs of others and join us in this effort. There are always needs, and we encourage you to sponsor one of these building projects.

Home Missions and Evangelism

Report to the 2018 Convention of OFWB

The work of Home Missions and Evangelism continues to be under the Executive Committee of the Convention in order to foster a spirit of transparency and to build confidence in the effectiveness of the direction of Home Missions. Therefore, the Executive Committee is (1) to oversee and direct the Home Missions and Evangelism Board for a period of not less than one year and until such transparency and confidence is restored, and (2) to conduct an audit of the financial records of this ministry from 2006-2016 at the expense of Home Missions.

Since the 2016 May Convention, we have given four updates on our work. Below is an update since the 2017 Fall Conferences:

Concerning Home Missions' Tax Liability:

- According to Jeff Hale, CPA, Home Missions is up-to-date with the North Carolina Department of Revenue.
- Amy Wells, tax attorney from Greenville continues to assist us with questions concerning payroll taxes to the Internal Revenue Service.

Concerning Audit of the Financial Records from 2006-2016

- Jeff Hale, CPA, informed the Executive Committee that a full audit cannot be conducted given the conditions of the books, e.g. lack of receipts and accounting, checks written to cash with no documentation.
- Due to the lack of receipts, etc., we are recreating the books from the bank statements from 2006-2016. This work is in progress.

Concerning Home Missions' properties:

- The properties at Morehead, Landis and Whiteville are all currently occupied with tenants who are up to date with their monthly rental payments.
- The properties at Morehead, Landis and Whiteville have been offered to the present tenants. If these tenants decide not to purchase, we will list the properties with realtors in the locales where the properties are located.
- The property in Wilson has been sold, with Home Missions providing the financing. All payments are up to date.
- Home Missions owns three (3) time shares. Mr. Linwood Smith and the Reverend Don Fader are presently working on the procedure to sell these properties.

General Information

- The Home Missions office is now located at the Convention Services office in Mount Olive. (August 22, 2017)
- The Executive Committee approved compensation for the Reverend Doctor Josh Whitfield for his work with Home Missions from June 2016 to August 2017. (September 7, 2017)
- The Executive Committee approved employing the Reverend Franklin Baggett as Home Missions Interim Director. (January 11, 2018)

• At the direction of the Executive Committee, President Hobgood appointed an Advisory Council to work with the interim director. Those appointed thus far are The Reverend Roger Haithcock, The Reverend Dr. Brad Williamson and Mr. Ross Zacharzuk. Others will be added to the Council in the future. This Council reports directly to the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee would like to assure our churches and ministers that we are committed to a vision of planting churches and assisting our present churches with resources to aid in church revitalization.

We encourage our churches to continue to support Home Missions through their giving. This support is needed to retire our debt with Church Finance, pay our overdue taxes, and to make plans for our future. Report to the 106th Annual Session of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists

Mission Statement

"It is the purpose of The Free Will Baptist Minister's Program to serve the churches and ministers of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists. It is our assertion that the minister can best meet the spiritual requirements of a congregation if he is unencumbered by the burden of financial insecurity. To this end we provide administrative services, information resources, and educational opportunities. These are designed to help the minister and the local church plan together a program of compensation and benefits designed to meet the minister's present and future financial needs."

Purpose

Today the Minister's Program sponsors a retirement program for our ministers and we encourage our churches to make their participation possible. We also advocate on behalf of the minister by communicating to churches the unique needs of their pastor. We publish articles describing how churches can help the pastor, and each year we provide our churches with "The Church's Guide to Basic Compensation" which provides churches and pastors with information to help them establish a dialogue on this important issue.

This year we published the twenty third edition of the guide. Instead of guidance based on group averages, this guide makes recommendations using the church's actual attendance and revenue. We invite you to review the guide and make suggestions on changes and how it can best be used within our churches. Remember, the minister and church need to participate together in a plan that can provide for a secure financial future for the pastor and his family.

The Year in Review

Christmas Cheer This program has been very well received by our ministers and churches since it was first implemented. The Minister's Program sends out a request in early November and then about a week before Christmas we divide the funds received from our churches equally among all participating ministers age 65 and older. The gift that you provided in 2017 was \$122 which was over \$30 less when compared to \$154 in 2016. We hope that you will make 2018 a better year for our ministers. Most of all, it is important to remember that it is a gift from the churches of the Convention to pastors who have literally given their lives to the gospel ministry. This program is a way of saying we remember you, and we are grateful for what you have done.

110 ministers received this gift from YOU this past Christmas. These ministers depend on you to keep the program going. On behalf of those ministers receiving this gift we would like to thank the churches, individuals and the organizations within the church that made this possible. Every church should support Christmas Cheer and we hope that 2018 will be the year you say thank you to these men who have served and given unselfishly to our churches and the work of God's Kingdom through the years.

The Minister's Widow(er)s Fund and Surviving Minister's Fund Another program we offer to our ministers and their spouses is the Minister's Widow(er)s Fund and the Surviving Minister's Fund. For those who participate, this program provides a meaningful gift for fellow ministers or surviving spouses during a time of loss. The Minister's Program pays for the administrative cost of this program so that every dollar goes to the spouse.

Since the last report to this Convention we have lost by death five members who participated in the Minister's Widow(er)s Fund: The Reverends Edmundo Gonzalez, Billy Toler, Owen Arthur, Bryant Hines, and Frank Flowers. Participants in the Surviving Minister's Fund: Maxine Spivey, wife of the Reverend Edward Spivey and Lorraine Garner, wife of the Reverend Francis Garner passed away since our last seating of the Convention.

What Can Your Church Do?

The Minister's Program will continue to maintain a comprehensive plan whereby churches and pastors can work together, and we will make every effort to keep everyone informed in the area of taxation, compensation, retirement, and financial planning.

The only limit to the scope of this program is the level of support we receive from you, the local church. Your gift to us is a sacred trust, and we make every effort to provide the greatest benefit to our ministers with a minimum outlay for administrative costs.

We hope that you appreciate this fact and that you will continue to support this program with your prayers and gifts. Last year the board cut expenses and our churches maintained support at the previous year's level. This combination allowed the Minister's Program to finish the year in the black, and for that we are grateful and thank each of the churches who support the program with their gifts. We have no other source of revenue apart from the faithful support of God's people. Did your church give? If not please tell us what we need to do to earn the trust and confidence necessary to receive your support.

With what shall I come before the Lord, And bow myself before God on high? He has told you, O mortal, what is good; And what does the Lord require of you But to do justice, and to love kindness, And to walk humbly with your God? Micah 6:6, 8

Several years ago, one of our students said, "I'm saved. Now what?" What she meant by this question is that it is one thing to receive Christ as Lord and Savior. It is quite another to explore what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ, to know how to live, to seek justice, to love kindness, and to talk humbly with God.

The University of Mount Olive is a multi-faceted, complex institution of higher education. During the past nine years, we have greatly strengthened our finances, completed a capital campaign, developed graduate programs, added online education, and expanded our infrastructure, including building new student housing, renovating existing student housing, and building a state-of-the-art track and field. The University of Mount Olive serves students from 35 countries. We constantly seek to strengthen our academic programs and find new ways to strengthen relationships to our community.

At the center of University life is the spiritual life of the community. This is symbolized by the most recent capital improvement: the renovation of Rodgers Chapel, and the addition of a chapel complex, the E. Lee Glover Center for Religious Studies, which now houses our faculty in the department of religion, our chaplain, and our church relations coordinator. It includes two state-of-the-art classrooms, a prayer garden dedicated to Jean Ackiss in honor of her 50 years of service, and a completely remodeled chapel that includes a new Allen three-manual L-33 model organ that was made possible by an endowment by Vernice Jones.

We have built this Center for two reasons. One is to better serve our students. Six years ago at a church dinner, Dr. Philip P. Kerstetter, president, made the following observation: "Just as faith without works is dead, so is education without faith." We have designed our University of Mount Olive education to draw together faith and education in a symbiotic relationship. Faith has everything to do with how we live—how we "seek justice, love kindness and walk humbly with our God." The E. Lee Glover Center for Religious Studies—both symbolically and in actual study—allows the University of Mount Olive community to pursue these vital questions: How do we seek justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with our God? How do we live lives of faith? How do we put faith into action? How do we love the right people in the right way? I'm saved. Now what?

Housed in the Glover Center is the Barrow Center for Faith and Life—an integral part of our program in religious studies. A week prior to the start of the 2017 – 2018 academic year, our country was shaken by an outbreak of racial and anti-Semitic violence in Charlottesville, Virginia. In the wake of this violence, in many of our classes, chapel services, and in conversations both formal and informal, the UMO community sustained a conversation as to how we as Christians stand for justice and walk humbly with our God. We also initiated conversations on human trafficking—an issue for the Book of Exodus—and relationship violence, a subject addressed many times in the Bible. Many of these conversations unfolded in our classes on religion, but they were also addressed in other pertinent disciplines, including our honors program and classes in criminal justice and psychology. Each week we seek to serve our students by engaging them in the important questions of justice, kindness, and walking with God.

The other reason we built the Glover Center is to better serve our founding church. During the past year, we have done this through the Barrow Center for Church Leadership, which has supported the Convention Commission on Education in its excellent program, "Journey Through the Bible," our presentations in churches on "Jesus and the Power of Resurrection," and our seminar at Cragmont on "Jesus and Leadership." We also have events on campus for the community, including concerts and lectures. A program to support our founding church of which we are particularly proud is *The Challenge: Exploring God's Call*—a youth institute for the study of theology that is funded by a grant from the Lilly Endowment. The purpose of *The Challenge* is to cultivate leadership to ensure the future of the church. *The Challenge* has three purposes—to encourage high school participants to discern the call of God in their lives, to teach theology, and to challenge young people to become leaders in tomorrow's church. *The Challenge* takes place four times a year—in the summer on the UMO campus, in the fall on the UMO campus, in the winter at Cragmont Assembly, and in the spring in Washington DC. Our hope for *The Challenge* will be to make it sustainable for the future, as the grant cycle comes to a close.

This spring is a bittersweet time for the University community. We are celebrating the leadership of Dr. Philip and Mary Kerstetter as they transition into retirement. The students, faculty, and staff treasure Phil and Mary, their leadership and gracious hospitality. The University has accomplished substantial growth under their leadership, none of which is more important than strengthening relationships with our founding church. We are eternally grateful for their leadership, and we wish them God's blessing in retirement.

Recommendations to the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists:

- 1. That the Convention officially adopts this annual report of the University of Mount Olive.
- 2. That the Convention continues to designate February and July as Christian Education months and that Sunday Schools and churches be encouraged to designate Fifth Sundays as scholarship days for the benefit of Original Free Will Baptist students attending the University of Mount Olive.
- 3. That the Convention prays faithfully for the University, and that those who lead and serve the University of Mount Olive will work earnestly as God's agents for the transformation of women and men.
- 4. That the Convention rallies the churches to encourage their members to consider the University of Mount Olive as their choice for higher education at the location and in the program that will best serve their needs.
- 5. That the Convention encourages all churches to prayerfully and financially support the University of Mount Olive.

REPORT OF CAROLINA BIBLE INSTITUTE & SEMINARY TO THE 2018 CONVENTION OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS

Greetings from the Board of Trustees, the staff, and the student body of Carolina Bible Institute and Seminary to the officers, delegates, and Churches of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists and its member conferences, associations, and Churches. We are appreciative for this opportunity and very thankful for the great joy and privilege to share in this session of our convention and to make this report.

The purpose of a report such as this could be many faceted, but I would like to utilize this opportunity to express just two aspects of this ministry which, perhaps, may be of great interest to you: first, the educational philosophy which drives our efforts and secondly, news and concerns which have developed since our report to the 2017 Convention.

Several years ago, a preacher friend raised the question with me, "Why are you so determined to see Carolina Bible Institute grow and enlarge its ministry?" Since then, several others have asked similar questions. Well, these questions have resulted in many sessions of actual "soul searching" thought. So, briefly, I will share some of the conclusions concerning the "educational philosophy" which drives this ministry.

Farmers Insurance Company has some comical and innovative TV commercials. They show recreations of incidents (mostly comical) that have resulted in unusual insurance claims and then the announcer says, "We know a thing or two because we've seen a thing or two." Similarly, when you've "been around the block" as many times as I have, you've learned a "thing or two." I was licensed to preach the Gospel at the November 1973 setting of the Central Conference at Marlboro Church and ordained in November, 1974 at Aspen Grove Church, Central Conference. In November, 2018, I will celebrate 45 years of service to the Lord Jesus and the Original Free Will Baptist Church and this past January, I completed my 21st year as president of Carolina Bible Institute & Seminary – I've seen a "thing or two!"

I have observed that God honors the preaching of His Word, but not the philosophy of men. I've seen Churches that once thrived with godly men and women, become more concerned with social status than standing with God and His Word. I've learned that God's purpose for the Church is to impact the world for Christ, only to observe the world impacting the Church to become a sanctified social club. I've seen the Church shift to meeting the physical needs of society as opposed to meeting the eternal needs of the soul. I've learned that we will never see the fires of revival with a watered-down Gospel. I've watched as Churches, once filled with God's people, dwindle down to so few that they can hardly keep the doors open, let alone have an evangelistic ministry. I've seen pulpits that once burned with a passion for souls and thundered with the power of God, evolve into little more than an entertainment center with flashing neon lights and thundering unintelligible music. Sadly, I have observed a dissolving of the respect for God's preachers into a time when Bible preaching preachers are resented.

Contrariwise, I've seen God's blessings fall upon "men of the Word" and Churches that have stayed faithful to God's calling. In my travels around the "old Gospel circuit," I have watched men, who preached and practiced the "old paths," as the Holy Spirit honored their ministry. I don't want to sound so critical nor pessimistic, but we must face reality. "Somebody needs to do something!" I am convinced that our wonderful Lord moved upon Dr. Floyd Cherry in 1973 to "stand in the gap" by founding Carolina Bible Institute. I can speak with some measure of authority because I've been there since its founding. Dr. Cherry had the foresight, or should I say, "the leading of the Holy Spirit," to establish an educational institution where any and all who desired, could obtain instructions and training in the Word of God. For the last 21 years, the Board of Trustees, the teaching staff, along with the administrative team have endeavored to continue what Dr. Cherry began.

It is our conviction that, if we will be faithful to God's Word, God will be faithful to His Word - "But my God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus," Philip. 4:19. It is our belief that if we practice the precepts of God's Word and the Biblical examples of those who followed God's instructions and experienced God's provisions, we too, shall experience God's provision. But, we also believe that if we stray from the plain teachings of His Word, if we begin to incorporate "worldly" practices, if we fall into the trap of seeking to please men instead of seeking to please God, then God will withdraw His hand of blessing.

When the Southern Kingdom of Judah made the mistake of turning away from God's Word and God's Will, He sent the prophet Jeremiah to warn them of impending judgment, "Thus saith the LORD, Stand ye in the ways, and see, and ask for the old paths, where *is* the good way, and walk therein, and ye shall find rest for your souls. But they said, "We will not walk *therein*," Jeremiah 6:16 (KJV). Judah's refusal to be faithful to God's Word, along with their unwillingness to walk in the "old paths," resulted in God's judgment coming upon the Hebrew people and ushered in what the Bible calls "the time of the gentiles." Their refusal to be obedient to God's instructions resulted in the armies of Babylon, in 586 B.C., capturing Jerusalem and destroying the Temple of God. For approximately 2,604 years, the Hebrew people have not really had control of the Holy City. Even today, with the Jews back in Jerusalem since 1967 and with President Trump moving the United States Embassy to Jerusalem, the Jews still do not have control of the most Holy place on earth to them - the Temple Mount. Even after all this time the Muslim Waqf controls that sacred place! If God will allow such judgment to come upon His "chosen people," in that day, what should we expect will happen to our Church, if we fail to stay true to the Word of God?

From the beginning of this ministry, we have trusted God to use us for His glory and to "supply all our needs." We know God can do anything He chooses, but the facts are, God has chosen to use people to accomplish His purposes. That's why we ask for your support. It is our prayer that our Lord will place the desire upon your heart to provide the finances to continue this ministry of training men and women to do the work of ministry and doing it in accord with God's Word. As an individual or as a Church, will you join in the effort to "follow the old paths?"

We request your fervent prayers! Since the Convention met in 2017, two of our Board of Trustees members have gone to be with the Lord. Brother James "Donny" Crocker and Rev. Frank Flowers, both of these men were integral parts of this ministry. Brother Crocker was one of the original board members in 1973 and Brother Flowers served as Chairman of the Board of Trustees for several years. Brother Rudolph Jones, another of the original board members, is no longer able to actively serve on the Board because of health problems. Please join us in prayer as we seek God's leadership to find just the right individuals to replace these brothers. As of this writing, we are diligently searching for the men God has for these responsibilities.

Thank you for all you have done through your prayers, your financial support, your encouragement and for all that you are going to do.

Chaplains Commission Report

The Chaplains Commission has the task of recruiting and commissioning chaplains to the United States Armed Forces, hospitals, prisons, college campuses, and other chaplain positions. Military chaplains are required to have a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university and a Master of Divinity (75 semester hours of credit) degree from an accredited seminary or divinity school plus two years of active ministry. Armed forces chaplains provide ministry to men and women of our armed forces and their families. Chaplains enter their branch of service as a commissioned officer, 1st Lieutenant (Army and Air Force) or Lieutenant Junior Grade (Navy and Coast Guard), and they are promoted based on performance and need. The Navy provides chaplains to the Marine Corps. They train as military officers in order to minister in a hostile environment or in peace. They also train for ministry to families of military personnel, including providing counseling to families of deployed military personnel and to provide marriage and family counseling to families in very difficult circumstances such as long separations. Military chaplains are never required to participate in religious services outside their own faith group (OFWB Chaplains are Protestant Christian, and as such, will provide ministry in any Protestant worship service). In worship, Christian chaplains are never denied the privilege of praying in the Name of Jesus or proclaiming Christian doctrines. In public ceremonies and ecumenical services, however, each chaplain is cautioned to be sensitive to people of other faith groups in their prayers or speeches.

Military chaplains are never required to perform same sex marriages or unions if their denomination has provided a letter informing the chaplain of the denominational stance. We have provided that letter.

If any of our ministers meet the educational requirements and are interested in serving as a military chaplain, please see anyone on our Chaplains Commission. The Convention of Original Free Will Baptists now has only one chaplain in the military – he is CH (MAJ) Richard Holmes of the US Air Force. Chaplain Holmes has been selected for promotion to Lieutenant Colonel as of this writing. At the Convention, he might be promoted.

The Convention of Original Free Will Baptists is a member of the National Conference on Ministry to the Armed Forces. We represent at the annual meeting of that body where we receive updates on any changes in requirements for chaplains, changes in policy, or changes in in the law regarding chaplains.

Professional chaplains serving in hospitals and prisons also must be endorsed by their denomination to serve as chaplains. The educational requirements in these areas are similar to military chaplaincy plus Clinical Pastoral Education in varying units. We have one chaplain on a college campus. Chaplain Carla Williamson is Campus Minister at the University of Mount Olive.

Several of our ministers serve as volunteer chaplains for police and fire departments, Civil Air Patrol, or in hospitals. They are not required to be endorsed, but if you are serving in a volunteer capacity, the Chaplains Commission would like to know who you are and in what capacity you serve. Dr. Richard Glosson is a volunteer at Wayne Memorial Hospital in Goldsboro, NC at least one day per month, a volunteer Chaplain for the Wayne County Sheriff's Department, and a paid Chaplain for Marketplace Chaplains USA.

Commission on Education for Christian Ministry

Report to the Convention, May 2018

It is the task of this Commission to encourage all who are called to some form of Christian ministry to use every opportunity to prepare themselves for effective service. This includes not only those who are called to vocational ministry in the life of the church but also lay persons whose gifts are used to advance the mission and ministries of the church. One of our primary duties and responsibilities is to encourage and provide information on educational opportunities for those called to Christian ministry, including pastoral services, children, youth, and student ministry, services to the elderly, church music, counseling, Christian education and other such vocations.

The Barrow Center for Church Leadership and the Commission on Education for Christian Ministries is offering courses two times a year—in the winter and fall—for lay leaders as well as church staff members and/or ordained ministers seeking to strengthen their biblical knowledge and skills for serving the church. These courses are part of a certificate program. Each course consists of 5—6 sessions held on Sunday nights beginning at 6 PM for 2—2½ hours per session. To receive a certification in a particular area, participants will have to complete a designated number of 5—6 weeks courses.

These courses are being offered as a simulcast to churches throughout our denomination for only \$80 per church. Individuals may also sign up to view these courses over the internet from the comfort of their own home via their computer, iPad or tablet, etc. for only \$30 per person. Our presenters will choose from the list of churches who have signed up for the simulcast, and present from the location nearest to them.

In the Winter of 2018, we held the Journey Into the Bible course featuring presentations by Dr. John Blackwell, Dr. Brad Williamson, Dr. Josh Whitfield, Dr. David Hines, the Rev. Stephen Prescott, and Dr. Neal Cox.

Beginning on September 9, we will be offering the Journey Into the Articles of Faith course featuring representatives from the different board of ordinations as teachers. More information is available at the Commission on Education for Christian Ministries table, will be mailed out to churches, and will appear in future editions of *The Community Magazine*.

 - Priorities of the Foundation include scholarships for the education of those called to Christian ministry, planned and direct gifts from individuals and endowments for churches, ministries of the Convention and other Charities.

WELCOME TO THE FOUNDATION

The North Carolina Foundation for Christian Ministries was established in 2005. It is a nonprofit corporation formed under the laws of the State of North Carolina and has been recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as an organization which is exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, and as a public charity. As such, gifts to the Foundation are tax-exempt.

Governance and Management

The Foundation is governed and managed by a diversified board of nine members, all of whom are Original Free Will Baptists.

Mission

As an affiliated ministry of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists, the mission of the Foundation is to communicate the Christian faith by serving as a medium for charitable and educational purposes.

Who We Are

The North Carolina Foundation for Christian Ministries is a legally established and officially recognized nonprofit corporation primarily serving Christian and educational purposes. From its beginning in 2005, the Foundation has grown steadily in its ability to serve people, organizations, and ministries by assisting them in achieving their goals for charitable giving or service. The success of the Foundation can be attributed to the vision and design of its Founding President, Dr. W. Burkette Raper and the vigilance of its nine-member board of directors, which ensure adherence to its standards of excellence.

The principal office of the Foundation is located at 201 W. James Street, Mount Olive, NC and its address is P. O. Box 210, Mount Olive, NC 28365. The Foundation is an affiliated ministry of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists.

What We Do

Much of what the Foundation does centers on receiving cash gifts or other assets from donors. We then set up processes that ensure the gift will be legally distributed to ministries, colleges, or other charities according to the donors' wishes. This can be done through a variety of means to best meet the need.

The Foundation is able to help good people advance the gospel of Jesus Christ and achieve positive, lasting results for humanity. This is achieved by bringing together people who wish to leave a lasting legacy with those who can provide the financial and legal services that are needed. In this way, people who have modest means can receive the same benefits and assurances in their philanthropic endeavors as those who have considerable wealth.

Endowments

Endowments are funds that are permanently invested and never spent. Each year, the growth of the fund is used to provide support for the qualified non-profit named by the donor. There is no minimum amount required to initiate an endowment and gifts can be made by anyone, at any time, and in any amount. Distributions begin on year after the fund reaches \$10,000. From 2007 through 2017, the Foundation has made endowment distributions in the total amount of \$1,174,243.80.

Endowments may be established with the Foundation by individuals, families, churches, ministries, church-related organizations and other public-spirited donors. Annual distributions from these endowments provide permanent support for qualified beneficiaries. In general, creating an endowment includes: 1) Defining the purpose of the endowment and the charitable beneficiary(ies), 2) An agreement with the Foundation that assures compliance with the applicable rules and regulations of the Internal Revenue Code; and 3) An establishing gift.

Shepherd's Fund

The Shepherd's Fund provides scholarships to help overcome the financial barrier that prevents many from seeking education for the ministry. Recipients of scholarships from this fund must be Original Free Will Baptists attending accredited colleges, divinity schools, or seminaries. Funding for these scholarships comes from a combination of direct gifts from donors each year and from established endowments designated for that purpose.

For scholarship purposes, the Foundation defines "Christian Ministry" as pastoral services or a vocation in a church or institution that is under the auspices of the Church, including ministry to youth, the elderly, church music, Christian education, chaplaincy, missions and other Christian services to humanity. Scholarships for other needs may be funded by other endowments.

Since 2006, the Shepherd's Fund has provided more than \$240,391.16 in scholarships for Original Free Will Baptist students who are preparing for excellence in Christian ministry at academically accredited institutions of Christian higher education, including the University of Mount Olive, Campbell University Divinity, Southeastern Theological Seminary, Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, Moody Bible Institute, Princeton Theological Seminary, Regent University School of Divinity, Asbury Theological Seminary, Washington Theological Union, Barton College, Duke University, Union Theological Seminary, St. Thomas University, George Truett Seminary of Baylor University, Gallaudet University, Wake Forest Divinity School and Abilene Christian University

Planned Giving

Planned giving (gift planning) enables donors to make larger gifts than they could normally make from their income. While some planned gifts provide a life-long income to the donor, others use estate and tax planning to provide for charities and other heirs in ways that maximize the gift and minimize its impact on the donor's estate. A planned gift is any major gift, made in one's lifetime or at one's death as part of a donor's overall financial and estate planning.

Gifts in One's Honor or Memory

Gifts of any size may be given to the Foundation, to any of its Endowments, or to the Shepherd's Fund. This is often an excellent way to honor someone on a special occasion or remember someone following their passing. Tasteful acknowledgements are sent on behalf of the donor and the amount of the gift is not included.

Footprints

Vice President, Dianne Riley Gray, reported the Woman's Auxiliary Convention will be held May 11, 2017, hosted by the Central District at Marlboro OFWB Church, Farmville, NC, and beginning at 9:00 am. A tear out registration form will be in the program book. The 2017 Standard of Achievements should be sent to the Vice President by March 1, 2017.

Corresponding Secretary, Sandy White, had nothing to report.

May Pittman reported the following for OFWB International (Foreign Missions):

- Caleb's Dollar Ministry continues to grow and feed children, over 600 per day in Christian Schools in Liberia,
 W. Africa.
- A School Children's Gala Day Activity was held at King's College, a school supported by Caleb's Dollar Ministry.
- In the Philippines, two weeks of VBS was conducted with 59 children attending with a police officer as a guest speaker. He reminded the children that police should be a friend to everyone. In Santa Maria, an outdoor meeting for family fellowship and thanksgiving for students graduating at different levels of studies was held and also a baptismal service.
- The church in Cebu is being constructed by contributions from churches in the Visayes, Mindanao, and Luzon. An evangelism film shone in November had over 200 in attendance.
- The First FWB Christian School in Puerto Princesa City, Palawan, began the 2016-2017 school year with 175 students and 12 teachers. A program regarding Nutrition Month Celebration emphasized the value of a healthy body and nutritious eating.
- The Church in Bulgaria responded to the need of food on Stralja and to homeless people of Asparhovo, singing songs about God in Turkish, Bulgarian, and Gypsy and praying with them.

- Although persecution continues, the churches in Guinea are doing well. Last year, one branch relocated four times due to persecution from Muslims, yet growth never ceases.
- Telethon to be held March 26 with a goal of \$225,000.
- Short-Term Mission trip to Mexico planned for July 8 15.
- Harold wants invitations to share information with churches.
- Harold and Sandra will go to the Philippines April 18 May 4 to attend a Convention and a wedding.

The Executive Committee of the Convention of OFWB is working to clear issues with Home Missions. Reports will be forthcoming. Kits, Kids Kare boxes, and other projects are not needed now, but may be in the future. Be in special prayer for Home Missions. It is a critical time for Home Missions as well as a critical time in our denomination.

In promoting Missions, May also helped hand out bags for freshmen at UMO on August 20, attended Central District Auxiliary meeting, Central District study courses, Central Conference Meeting, Friends of Children at Children's Home, and Directed Woman's Retreats at Cragmont.

- The Church in Varna carried clothes, hats, gloves and scarves to some very poor families in hope of sharing the Gospel with them later.
- The Church in Varna took children from the Day of the Christian Family to enjoy some pizza and see a movie. Pastor Kosta talked to them about Christian values in the family.
- The church in Balchik enjoyed a Christmas with the children, youth, and disables children. They helped sick people and fed the hungry, giving thanks to the OFWB Missions program.
- It is requested that VBS contributions go to Caleb's Dollar Ministry to feed the children in our schools in other countries.
- In Liberia, the traveling companion of Rev. Gnininte, the Rev. Moses Targblor, passed away in January. On February 11, a church in Pleebo City, Maryland County, was completely destroyed by a violent storm.
- Churches in Guinea face persecution on a daily basis. They are still strong and growing. Pastor David organized a crusade where many gave their lives to Christ. Pray daily for them.
- Telethon goal of \$225,000 is short with only \$155,000 in contributions, down from previous year.
- Mission trips to Mexico cancelled due to unrest there. No future trips planned unless finances pick up.
- Harold and Sandra returned from visiting Cebu and Palawan in the Philippines. They attended the annual convention, a wedding, and visited several churches.

The Executive Committee of the Convention of OFWB decided to sell all equipment and belongings of the Harvest Connection in an auction held April 1. Please continue to remember Home Missions in special prayer at this critical time in our denomination.

May gave a report on the Cragmont Woman's Retreats. Morning Star went well and other retreats are to follow through the summer. She also attended the Cinderella Sisters Retreat at Cragmont, LIFE institute, Central District Convention, and directed Morning Star Retreat.

We were asked if we need to review the Study Course responsibilities. Does it need new life? Is there a way to make it more relevant for younger people? Bring thoughts and suggestions to the January meeting.

No Benevolence report was available.

Heather McPherson, Youth Representative, reported:

- All Youth Districts represented at a day at the Children's Home in October. Lunch, fellowship, a worship service, games, and crafts were provided for all in attendance. Proceedings

The 73rd annual session of the Albemarle Conference of Original Free Will Baptists was held at Malachi Chapel Original Free Will Baptist Church in Columbia, North Carolina on Wednesday October 4, 2017, with the Reverend Al Markuson moderating.

The session convened at 9:30 a.m. with the singing of the hymn "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" led by Brother Lloyd Jones Jr., with Sister Lucy Jones serving as pianist. The morning devotion was brought by The Reverend Keith Pelletier of Malachi Chapel Church, speaking on the topic of "the importance of relationships" from the Book of Ecclesiastes, closing with prayer. Blended Fellowship Mission Report 163rd Cape Fear Conference of Original Free Will Baptists

Thank you so much for your faithful support of Blended Fellowship through prayer, financial support, donated items, volunteer help and various other forms of assistance. As I was writing this report, I heard the sounds of our Deaf volunteers as they were working, laughing and moving about throughout the building and I was reminded of how grateful I am that we can provide a place of purpose, meaning and communication for these precious people. Many of

you have helped us to have the facility they think of as their second home. Thank you for caring, giving and working to vastly improve the quality of life for these special people.

Our ministry is similar to that of the Salvation Army except that we are committed specifically to meeting the needs of Deaf families and blended families, those that include Deaf and hearing members. The services we provide have evolved based on the needs we have discovered. To meet these needs, we either connect our client families with available resources or we provide direct assistance. The services we provide can be grouped into three major programs. The first is **Spiritual Development**. This area of ministry focuses on helping each individual to reach their full potential in Christ. Spiritual development is foundational and integral with all we do. Our congregation is a part of this program.

The second program is **QLI**, which stands for **Quality of Life Improvement**. This program includes all the "hands on" ministry areas such as managing a food pantry, receiving and distributing donated items, providing hot meals, making appointments, scheduling transportation, assisting with housing needs and helping with personal financial management.

The third program we call **FACES**, which is an acronym for **Family Awareness and Communication Enhancement Services**. The focus here is on communication within blended families of deaf and hearing. We provide training and counseling for these families to bring about awareness of the differences between the hearing and deaf cultures. We also offer sign language training to improve communication and understanding. The Blended Bridges summer day camp we provide each July falls under this program.

This year has been one of many successes and blessings. With the help of a Raleigh based consulting firm, we recently received our very first grant and have applied for a second one.

You may recall from last year's report that a dear family included us in their estate planning which enabled us to begin renovation of the previously unusable half of our building. That renovation project has been progressing steadily and the work is near completion.

Also this year, we have begun weekly meetings with advisors to plan and coordinate improvements to our infrastructure and clarify our work. Though it has been a challenge to add these meetings to our schedule, the resulting improvements are making us more effective and also more attractive to potential significant funding sources. Another result of these planning sessions has been the establishment of teams of volunteers with their own leaders to help distribute the tremendous workload.

Recently, at our annual Deaf Judgement House event, 122 people attended of which 44 accepted Christ as Savior! 43 of those saved were Deaf! To God Be the Glory!

This year has also presented some challenges. We are about \$28,000 short of what we need to complete our renovation project. Some of you have heard about this need and responded and we are forever grateful to you. To those of you just hearing about this need today, we thank you in advance for anything you can do to help.

Also, due to an increase in needs and a reduction in the donations we receive from Walmart, we are asking for your help with care packages. These packages will be given to our clients twice a year in July and December. Your help with these items will enable us to distribute more perishable food items each week.

One other current need is more regular funding to enable us to add much needed trained professional staff and to fairly compensate our current staff who have not received a pay increase in 10 years.

To those of you who are providing regular support I want to assure you that you are the backbone of our ministry and we could not continue to meet the countless spiritual and physical needs without you.

If you would like more information about the services we provide or if you would like to be more involved in our work, we encourage you to contact us, plan a visit or invite me to your church and I would be happy to share with you what God is doing through Blended.

Again, thank you for your support of the ministry of Blended Fellowship.

Report of the Church Growth Committee of the Central Conference

"On November 9, 2001 the Central Conference formed the Church Growth Committee. As stated by the Conference the purpose of the Church Growth Committee is, "to promote and provide financial support for church growth and /or leadership development. Through the work of the committee, Central Conference churches will be more fully equipped to effectively reach people without Christ in their communities." The following guidelines were established for distributing funds:

- 1. The church Growth Committee will submit an annual budget to the Central Conference for approval.
- 2. The maximum amount of allocated funds will not exceed \$500 per quarter per church.
- 3. Funds must be used for church growth and/or leadership development.
- 4. The Church Growth Committee will strive to equally fund (contingent upon church requests) growth projects and leadership development programs.
- 5. Approvals for funds by the Church Growth Committee will be submitted to the Central Conference Treasurer for actual disbursement.

We invite your church to submit applications to this committee to request funds to help your church with growth projects and/or leadership development programs. When we receive an application, we will review and do all that we can to get funds to you for this program. We encourage every church to use this resource that has been made available by the Central Conference.

The following dates are deadlines for applications to be submitted. The dates are based on the four quarters of the church year. please submit your application within plenty of time of the event or project.

February 1, 2018 April 1, 2018 July 1, 2018 October 1, 2018

This past year 2016 – 2017 your Church Growth Committee received requests from two churches and approved them both. Reedy Branch Church was given \$500 to assist with the expenses of new stage lighting for their youth dramatic presentations.

Rose of Sharon Church was given \$500 to send their youth director to a youth leaders' conference in Tennessee to gain new ideas for the growth of their group.

The Church Growth Committee also met on February 24, 2017 at the Reedy Branch Church to discuss ways we as a Committee may be of greater service to the churches and leadership teams of the Central Conference.

It was noted that our annual budget is \$1,000. This amount may need to be expanded in the near future.

Ideas were discussed in sort of a brainstorming manner for impacting our Central Conference Churches for church growth and evangelism.

The following questions were discussed:

- How could we promote outreach ministries in our local churches? leadership development?

Inclusions to this report:

- 1. The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists in Section 1: The Local Congregation states the following concerning the church's calling of a pastor: "The church shall call its own pastor, from among the duly Ordained Original Free Will Baptist ministers who are approved by the Conference of which the church is a member." We wish to remind any church in our Conference, when extending a call to a minister to serve as your pastor, to be sure that the minister gets proper clearance from the Conference Board of Ordination before assuming duties as pastor of the church.
- 2. All candidates for ordination in the Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptists must meet the educational requirements set forth by the Conference of November 8, 2007 and take and pass the Ordination Examination.
- 3. We wish to remind all Central Conference ordained ministers be required to attend the annual session of the Conference each year. Requests for excusal shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of the Conference before the Conference, or within thirty days after the Conference for those with unanticipated causes for absence. Ministers who fail to attend the annual Conference physically for three consecutive years shall be subject to lose their credentials.
- 4. In accordance with "The Articles of Faith and Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of The English General Baptist Heritage) under 'The Rules of Church Government,' 'Section 1: The Local Congregation,' 'Meetings Of the Local Congregation:' 'The ordinances of the Gospel are administered only by ordained ministers.'" These ordained ministers must be ministers approved by the Central Conference Board of Ordination.
- 5. Upon requests, the Central Conference gives a Christian flag to the family of a deceased ordained minister who is a member of the Conference.

- 6. All Ordained Ministers of the Central Conference must maintain membership in an Original Free Will Baptist Church.
- 7. In accordance with the Convention of Original Free Will Baptist resolution, Central Conference Ministers are permitted only to marry a man and a woman, no same sex marriage.
- 8. Licensed Ministers from any conference are not allowed to be interim pastors in the Central Conference. Licensed Ministers cannot supply speak more than four Sundays in a calendar year in the same congregation, and two of those Sundays must have ninety days separating them.

The Board of Ordination stands ready to help people called to the Gospel Ministry.

Constitution and Bylaws

For

The Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists

Preamble

We, the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist denomination of North Carolina, desiring to be in fellowship in a bond of union, do ordain this constitution revised at annual session: November 7, 1979, November 4, 1981, November 10, 1982, November 8, 1984, November 9, 2000, November 8, 2001, November 4, 2004, November 4, 2010, and _______.

Article One: Name of the Organization

The name of the organization shall be The Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptists (referred hereafter in this document as "the Organization" or "the Conference.")

Article Two: Purpose

The Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptists shall be a cooperative effort among member churches to advance the Kingdom of God by providing a disciplinary framework for ministers and churches, as well as supportive programs and mutual ministries.

Article Three: Members

- 3.1 Class of Membership
 - a) Ordained Minister: An Ordained Minister shall be an individual whose personal membership is in an Original Free Will Baptist congregation, who has met all of the criteria listed in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)*, and the criteria listed in this document in Article 3.2(a). Ordained Ministers, who are in good standing, are those ministers who ascribe to *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)*, attend the annual session of the Conference (or provide a letter of excusal), pay annual dues, and support the ministries of the Original Free Will Baptist Convention.
 - b) <u>Licensed Minister:</u> A Licensed Minister shall be an individual whose personal membership is in an Original Free Will Baptist congregation, who has met all of the criteria listed in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage), as well as the criteria listed in this document in Article 3.2(b) and other criteria set by the Board of Ordination that is adopted by the Central Conference.*
 - c) <u>Retired Ordained Minister</u>: A Retired Ordained Minister shall be an individual whose personal membership is in an Original Free Will Baptist congregation and who has notified the Conference Clerk of their retirement from parish ministry. The Retired Ordained Minister may continue to preach, provide short-term interim services, or other pastoral duties on a *limited basis* as personally desired. The Retired Ordained Minister is absolved of the requirements for conference attendance and dues as listed in Article 3.2(c).
 - d) <u>Congregation Delegate</u>: A Congregation Delegate is a member of an Original Free Will Baptist congregation who is in good standing with the Conference. The Delegate shall be entitled to attend all Conference meetings, hold Conference office(s), sponsor motions or resolutions, and vote on actions of the Central Conference as a representative of the congregation to which they belong as a member. A congregation shall have one delegate for each one hundred members, or part thereof. (Example: A congregation with a membership of 201 are allowed three delegates.) Eligibility to serve as a Congregation Delegate is found in 3.2(d).
 - e) <u>Member Congregation</u>: A Member Congregation is a gathered body of Christian believers who meet for worship and service within the membership of the Conference. Member Congregations, who are in good standing, are those congregations who ascribe to *The Articles of Faith and*

Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage), attend the annual session of the Conference, and contribute financially to the work and ministry of the Central Conference and the Ministries of the Original Free Will Baptist Convention. The criteria to become a Member Congregation is found in 3.2(e).

3.2 – Eligibility for Membership

- b) Ordained Minister: An Ordained Minister shall...
 - i. possess evidence of a divine call to Christian Ministry.
 - ii. hold membership in an Original Free Will Baptist congregation.
 - iii. maintain a good moral standard in keeping with the calling of the office of a minister.
 - iv. maintain a solid Biblical theology observant of the doctrine of the Original Free Will Baptist denomination, as indicated in the latest revision of *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage).*
 - v. properly register with the credentials committee before or at the annual session of the Conference.
 - vi. be required to attend the annual session of the Conference each year. Requests for excusal shall be submitted in writing to the Clerk of the Conference before the Conference, or within thirty days after the Conference for those with unanticipated causes for absence. Ministers who fail to attend the annual Conference physically for three consecutive years shall be to subject to lose their credentials.
 - vii. have all of the rights and privileges of the Conference; which include, but not limited to, making motions, drafting resolutions, voting, and holding office(s).

b) Licensed Minister: A Licensed Minister shall...

- i. possess evidence of a divine call to Christian Ministry.
- ii. hold membership in an Original Free Will Baptist congregation.
- iii. maintain a good moral standard in keeping with the calling of the office of a minister.
- iv. maintain a solid Biblical theology observant of the doctrine of the Original Free Will Baptist denomination, as indicated in the latest revision of *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage).*
- v. be required to attend the annual session of the Conference. Requests for excusal shall be submitted in writing to the Conference clerk before the Conference, or within thirty days after the Conference for those with unanticipated causes for absence. Licensed Ministers who fail to attend the annual Conference for three consecutive years without an excusal shall be referred to the Board of Ordination.
- vi. properly register with the credentials committee before or at the annual session of the Conference.
- vii. have all of the rights and privileges of the Conference, save that of voting; unless the Licensed Minister is a Congregation Delegate representing the congregation of which that one is a member.
- viii. complete the requirements outlined in Article 3.4(a).
- ix. be endorsed by their church, under the supervision of the Board of Ordination, and within the limits of their licensure time period as defined in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)*.

c) Retired Ordained Minister: A Retired Ordained Minister shall...

- i. give written notice of retirement to the clerk of the Conference.
- ii. not serve a congregation or ministry as full or part time staff.
- iii. hold revivals, short-term interims, and pulpit supply on a limited basis.
- iv. not be required to attend or contribute dues to the Conference; however, should they choose to attend, they must properly register with the credentials committee before, or at the annual session of the Conference.

v. have all of the rights and privileges of the Conference; which include, but not limited to, making motions, drafting resolutions, voting, and holding office(s).

d) Congregation Delegate: A Congregation Delegate...

- i. shall serve at the will and endorsement of the congregation of which they are a member.
- ii. shall vote in accordance with the general feelings of the majority of their congregation.
- iii. shall properly register with the credentials committee before or at the annual session of the Conference.
- iv. shall have all of the rights and privileges of the Conference; which include, but not limited to, making motions, drafting resolutions, voting, and holding office(s).
- v. may be an ordained minister from another Conference, if the minister's personal membership is in the representative congregation, and the minister registers as a delegate with the expressed approval of the congregation.

e) Member Congregation: The Member Congregation shall...

- i. send an annual church report indicating statistical and financial data demonstrating the congregation's health and benevolent work in their community, as well as to the denomination's ministries.
- ii. contribute financially to the work of the Conference as specified in Article 3.3(c).

3.3 – Dues/Fees

a) Due for Ordaining:

- i. Dues for Ordained Ministers are set by the Executive Committee and shall be communicated to the membership at least 60-days before the annual Conference.
- ii. Dues for an Ordained Minister is waived only during the first year of Conference membership, or when the Ordained Minister properly registers as a Retired Ordained Minister.

b) <u>Dues for Licensed Ministers:</u>

The Conference waives all dues for Licensed Ministers.

c) <u>Dues for Member Congregations:</u>

The Executive Committee shall set a suggested contribution for Member Congregations payable to the Central Conference at (or before) the session of the annual Conference.

3.4 – Requirements to Become Members

a) Becoming a Licensed Minster:

- The process for a member of an Original Free Will Baptist Church to become a Licensed Minister of the Central Conference is well-outlined in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)* under the Rules of Church Government, Section Two, subsection titled, "Examination and Qualifications for License."
- ii. The congregation in a business session must recommend the candidate to the Central Conference's Board of Ordination for examination for license with a letter signed by the clerk and pastor.
- iii. The Board of Ordination shall give all applicants an examination of matters of faith, doctrine, polity, and work of the ministry. They shall also investigate matters of reputation, ability, educational, and professional qualifications.
- iv. Having successfully passed the examination and investigation, the candidate is recommended back to the congregation, who shall issue the candidate a license for one year.
- v. The license of the applicant must be renewed annually and not be allowed to lapse during the time before ordination.

b) Becoming an Ordained Minister:

- i. The process for a Licensed Minister of an Original Free Will Baptist Church to become an Ordained Minister of the Central Conference is well-outlined in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)* under the Rules of Church Government, Section Two, subsection titled, "Examination and Qualifications for Ordination."
- ii. The candidate must have been licensed for one year and not more than five years.
- iii. The local congregation of which the Licensed Minister is a member shall request that the Board of Ordination give the Licensed Minister the examination for ordination. The request must be signed by the clerk and pastor of the candidate's church.
- iv. The candidate must have successfully completed the examination administered by the Board of Ordination. The inquiry into the candidate's educational achievements shall include knowledge of theology, homiletics, church history, the Bible, and church government with special emphasis on polity, doctrine, and history of the Original Free Will Baptist denomination.
- v. The candidate must also ascribe to the Ministerial Code of Ethics as adopted by the Central Conference.
- vi. Upon satisfactory completion of the examination and all other requirements of the Conference, the council administers the rite of ordination as outlined in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage).*

c) Becoming a Member Congregation:

- i. The process for a congregation to become a member of the Central Conference is welloutlined in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)* under the Rules of Church Government, Section One, subsection titled, "Organizing and Establishment of a New Church from a Mission."
- ii. The congregation/mission shall make application to the Central Conference Executive Committee.
- iii. The Conference Executive Committee shall conduct an investigation of the congregation to assess at least, but not limited to; (1) a sufficient number of responsible believers, (2) doctrine, practice, polity, and purpose, (3) location, (4) potential for financial income, (5) potential for future growth and development.
- iv. When all requirements found in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government* for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage) and the Central Conference Executive Committee have been satisfied, the Conference moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship and the congregation will be listed among the churches in good standing.

3.5 – Disciplinary Procedures

a) <u>Disciplinary Procedures for a Licensed Minister</u>

- i. If a Licensed Minister walks disorderly or is perceived to have done so, a charge may be brought against the minister by submitting the charge in writing to the Board of Ordination, signed by the accuser(s), along with evidence to support the charge.
- ii. The charges must be examined by the Board of Ordination to determine if they are legitimate in reference to matters of doctrine, polity, ethics, or morality.
- iii. The minister is entitled to face the author(s) of the charges and to present a proper defense. The Board of Ordination conducting the trial has an obligation to the minster to render a verdict of guilty, or to dismiss the charge(s) to clear the minister's name.
- If the minister's name is cleared, no public record is made except at the request of the accused minister.
- v. If the minister is found guilty, the standing of the minister may be made known to the appropriate congregation(s) and to the Central Conference.
- vi. The minutes of the trial should be recorded only in the minutes of the Board of Ordination, or Executive Committee when they are involved in the trial.

- vii. The results of the trial shall be reported at the annual session of the Central Conference.
- viii. There shall be no secret meetings/trials or "off the record" meetings in reference to a charge or accusation.
 - ix. There shall be no secret disciplinary actions taken or enacted that are not reported to the annual session of the Conference in the Board of Ordination's report.
 - x. An appeal process is described, along with the trial process, in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)* at Rules of Church Government, Section Two: the Ministry, <u>Relationship to the Conference</u>, 4(e).

b) <u>Disciplinary Procedures for an Ordained or Retired Minister</u>

- i. If an Ordained or Retired Minister walks disorderly or is perceived to have done so, a charge may be brought against the minister by submitting the charge in writing to the Board of Ordination, signed by the accuser(s), along with evidence to support the charge.
- ii. The charges must be examined by the Board of Ordination to determine if they are legitimate in reference to matters of doctrine, polity, ethics, or morality.
- iii. If the charges reflect factionalism in the congregation, the matter will be referred to the Executive Committee of the Central Conference and the Board of Ordination.
- iv. The minister is entitled to face the author(s) of the charges and to present a proper defense. The Board of Ordination conducting the trial has an obligation to the minister to render a verdict of guilty, or to dismiss the charge(s) to clear the minister's name.
- v. If the minister's name is cleared, no public record is made except at the request of the accused minister.
- vi. If the minister is found guilty, the standing of the minister may be made known to the respective congregation(s) and the Central Conference.
- vii. The minutes of the trial should be recorded only in the minutes of the Board of Ordination, or executive committee when they are involved in the trial.
- viii. The results of the trial shall be reported at the annual session of the Central Conference.
- ix. There shall be no secret meetings/trials or "off the record" meetings in reference to a charge or accusation.
- x. There shall be no secret disciplinary actions taken or enacted that are not reported to the annual session of the Conference in the Board of Ordination's report.
- xi. An appeal process is described, along with the trial process, in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)* at Rules of Church Government, Section Two: the Ministry, <u>Relationship to the Conference</u>, 4(e).

c) <u>Disciplinary Procedures for a Member Elected to a Board or Committee</u>

- i. If an officer or board member walks disorderly or is perceived to have done so, a charge may be brought against the officer or board member by submitting the charge in writing to the Board of Ordination and/or the Executive Committee, signed by the accuser(s), along with evidence to support the charge.
- ii. The charges must be examined by the Board of Ordination to determine if they are legitimate in reference to matters of doctrine, polity, ethics, or morality.
- iii. The officer or board member is entitled to face the author(s) of the charges and to present a proper defense. The Board of Ordination conducting the trial has an obligation to the minster to render a verdict of guilty, or to dismiss the charge(s) to clear the individual's name.
- iv. If the individual's name is cleared, no public record is made except at the request of the accused person.
- v. If the individual is found guilty, the standing of the individual may be made known to the congregation and to the Central Conference.
- vi. The minutes of the trial should be recorded only in the minutes of the Board of Ordination, or Executive Committee when they are involved in the trial.
- vii. The results of the trial shall be reported at the annual session of the Central Conference.
- viii. There shall be no secret meetings/trials or "off the record" meetings in reference to a charge or accusation.

- ix. There shall be no secret disciplinary actions taken or enacted that are not reported to the annual session of the Conference in the ordination council's report.
- x. An appeal process is described, along with the trial process, in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)* at Rules of Church Government, Section Two: The Ministry, <u>Relationship</u> to the Conference, 4(e).

3.6 – Resignation or Transfer of Membership

a) Resignation of Licensure by a Licensed Minister

- i. If a Licensed Minister wishes to surrender the license issued by the congregation, the minister should first consider the matter with fervent prayer.
- ii. The minister should meet with the pastor of the sponsoring congregation and surrender whatever certificate or document issued by the congregation.
- iii. The minister, along with the congregation's pastor, should inform the Central Conference Board of Ordination of this decision.
- iv. The Central Conference Board of Ordination shall include this decision in their report at the annual session of the Conference

b) Resignation of Credentials by an Ordained or Retired Minister:

- i. If an Ordained or Retired Ordained Minister wishes to surrender the ordination credentials issued by the Conference, the minister should first consider the matter with fervent prayer.
- ii. The minister should meet with the Central Conference Board of Ordination to discuss the decision to surrender credentials.
- iii. If no resolution or reconsideration is met, the minister will deliver the credential certificate with a written letter of intent.
- iv. The Central Conference Board of Ordination shall include this decision in their report at the annual session of the Conference.

c) Transfer of a Member Congregation to another Original Free Will Baptist Conference

- i. For congregations wishing to transfer Conference membership to another Original Free Will Baptist Conference, the congregation shall in a duly scheduled and announced business meeting, vote to transfer membership to a specific Conference within the Original Free Will Baptist denomination.
- ii. The intent to transfer shall be communicated in writing to the Executive Committee of the Central Conference, signed by the officers of the congregation.
- iii. The transferring congregation shall also make petition to the potential receiving Conference's Executive Committee according to their adopted process.
- iv. The Executive Committee of the Central Conference shall meet with the potential receiving Conference's Executive Committee to discuss the matter with the officers of the congregation.
- v. When, in the judgment of both Executive Committees, the congregation has sufficiently demonstrated its desire to transfer to another Conference, the congregation is granted transfer and removed from the list of member churches of the Central Conference.
- vi. In cases where the congregation's property is also deeded to the Central Conference, the Conference shall transfer all rights to the property over to the independent congregation as soon as feasible.
- vii. In cases where a congregation wishes to unite with the Central Conference, the congregation must fulfill the requirements for transfer set by their original Conference.

d) Transfer of Credentials of an Ordained or Retired Ordained Minister

- i. The process for transfer of credentials to another Conference is outlined in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)* in Section Two: the Ministry, under <u>Relationship to the Conference</u>, item two.
- ii. The minister remains a member of the Central Conference until the transfer process is complete.

e) Transfer of License of a Licensed Minister

- i. A Licensed Minister may not transfer to another Conference and maintain licensure.
- ii. If a Licensed Minister wishes to transfer to another Conference, the candidate must surrender the license and transfer personal membership to a church within the other Conference and start the process over again with the new Conference.
- iii. If a Licensed Minister wishes to move their membership to another church during the licensure process, the original license issues by the candidate's home congregation will be voided, and the candidate shall start the process over again with the receiving congregation after one year of membership.

Article Four: Organization Officers

4.1 -Name of Offices

The Conference shall elect officers from among its members to fill the offices of Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer. These officers shall serve as an Executive Board, whose duties are outlined in *Article Six: Executive Committee*.

4.2 –Nomination and Election of Officers

- A nominating committee shall be appointed by the moderator of the Conference for nominating to the Conference any properly credentialed Conference member to serve in the capacity in which he or she could be elected.
- ii. The nominating committee shall compose a list of offices eligible to be filled and seek possible candidates or recommendations to fill those availabilities. The list shall contain only one name per position. The list of nominations shall be placed before the Conference in one of the business sessions.

4.3 –Eligibility to Serve as an Officer

Any member, minister, or retired minister, who is a member of an Original Free Will Baptist Church within the membership of the Central Conference is eligible to serve in any capacity on the Executive Committee as an Officer.

4.4 -Term of Service

- a) All officers shall be elected from the membership of the Conference to fill terms of two years.
- b) Each office has a term limit of 4 years (2 two-year terms) except that of the Treasurer, who is granted a maximum of 10 years (5 two-year terms) before becoming ineligible to serve on the Executive Committee.
- c) An ineligible member may be eligible to serve again after one year off the board.

4.5 –Removal of an Officer from Position

- a) Should an officer need to be removed due to some ethical or moral indiscretion before the Conference, the executive committee (after sufficient investigation with the Board of Ordination) shall recommend to the annual session of the Conference for the officer's removal and proceed to elect a replacement.
- b) Should an officer need to be removed due to some ethical or moral indiscretion in the interim between annual sessions of the Conference, the executive committee (after sufficient investigation with the Board of Ordination) shall place the officer on suspension for the remainder of the interim period, recommend to the annual session of the Conference for the officer's removal, and proceed to elect a replacement.
- c) The Executive Committee may choose, if needed, to appoint an individual to temporarily fill the vacancy during the interim period.
- d) The accused officer maintains the right to a fair trial, appeal process, and if desired, the right to resign his or her office.
- e) An appeal process shall follow the outlined procedure found at 3.5(c) Disciplinary Procedures for a Member Elected to a Board or Committee.

4.6 -Vacancies

- a) Vacancies that occur at the annual session of the Conference (or at the decision of the Executive Committee) shall be filled at the Conference following the nominating process outlined in *Article 4.2 Nominating and Election of Officers* and according to the adopted parliamentary authority.
- b) Vacancies that occur in the interim period between annual sessions of the Conference shall be filled by candidates appointed by the executive committee. These appointments shall be reported to the Conference in the executive committee's report.

Article Five: Meetings

5.1 - Day

The Central Conference shall meet in November at a date, time, and place set by the Executive Committee. The date, time, and place shall be communicated to the Conference membership, and to the Convention of Original Free Will Baptists, not less than 120-days before the annual session of the Conference.

5.2 - Quorum

The annual session will be recognized as having a quorum when there is a majority of the members present for a meeting (ordained ministers and/or churches), as determined by the Executive Committee and records of the clerk, providing all the members of the Conference have been duly notified concerning the said meeting.

5.3 - Special Meetings

It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to transact the business of the Conference when the Conference is not in session. In the event a called special meeting is necessary for the entire Conference, the Executive Committee will set a date for said meeting with at least a four-week notice to member churches, licensed, ordained, and retired ordained ministers. The only business to be transacted at said meeting will be the specific business for which it is called.

5.4 - Cancellation of a Regularly Scheduled Meeting

The Executive Committee will have the duty of cancellation of a regularly scheduled meeting with just cause. Notification will be at the earliest date known for the decision of cancellation and will be carried out by the Conference clerk, in writing, or by other expeditious communication, i.e., email, text message, phone call, etc.

Article Six: Executive Committee

6.1 –Board Composition

The Executive Committee shall be composed of the elected officers of the organization—the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer.

6.2 – Meetings

The Executive Committee shall meet as often as necessary to conduct the business of the Conference between annual sessions; but not less than once per quarter.

6.3 –Duties of the Officers of the Board

- a) Moderator: The Moderator shall...
 - i. preside, according to parliamentary law, over the annual session of the Central Conference;
 - ii. appoint temporary committees, delegates, and representatives;
 - iii. serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and committees;
 - iv. perform the duties of the office of moderator as described in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage).*

b) Assistant Moderator: The Assistant Moderator shall...

- i. perform the duties of the Moderator when that officer is not present and shall assist the moderator when called upon.
- ii. in the event of resignation or death of the Moderator, the Assistant Moderator shall fill the vacancy until the next annual session of the Conference.

iii.

- c) Clerk: The Clerk shall...
 - record and preserve a permanent record of the proceedings of all sessions of the Central Conference.
 - ii. prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the Conference
 - iii. hold trust of all documents not otherwise preserved and surrender documents at the direction of the Conference or at the end of the term of office.
 - iv. conduct all official correspondence and sign documents requiring Conference authorization.
- d) Assistant Clerk: The Assistant Clerk shall...
 - i. perform the duties of the clerk when that officer is not present and shall assist the Clerk when called upon to do so.
 - ii. in the event of resignation or death of the Clerk, the Assistant Clerk shall fill the vacancy until the next annual session of the Conference.
- e) Treasurer: The Treasurer shall...
 - i. hold in trust all money that belongs to the Conference, except that held by other boards and committees of the Conference and surrender all financials at the direction of the Conference or at the end of the term of office.
 - ii. keep an accurate account of all funds received and distributed and shall produce an annual treasurer's report to the membership of the annual Conference.
- f) Assistant Treasurer: The Assistant Treasurer shall...
 - i. perform the duties of the Treasurer when that officer is not present and shall assist the Treasurer when called upon to do so.
 - ii. in the event of resignation or death of the Treasurer, the Assistant Treasurer shall fill the vacancy until the next annual session of the Conference.
- 6.4 Duties of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall...
 - a) act with the same authority as the Central Conference seated session during intervals between sessions on matters concerning ministers, churches, and other business as defined in as described in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage).*
 - b) not have the authority to convey property, or to change what the Conference has enacted during an annual session of the Conference.
 - c) plan and conduct the annual session of the Central Conference at a time and place according to *Article 5.1 Day*.
 - d) serve on behalf of the Central Conference as the trial committee in cases of church disputes as described in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)*.
 - e) approve the minutes of the Conference meeting before publication.

Article Seven – Committees and Representatives

7.1 – Board of Ordination

- a) The Board of Ordination, consisting of five ordained ministers of the Central Conference, shall be elected by the Conference. The term of office shall be for members to serve five-year rotational term and adjusted so one member rotating off each year.
- b) A member of the Board of Ordination is eligible to serve two consecutive full-term rotations (ten years) before being ineligible for a third consecutive full-term rotation.
- c) An ineligible member may be eligible to serve again after one year off the board.
- d) The board of ordination shall meet at least once per quarter at a time and place determined by the chairperson.
- e) It shall be the duty of the Board of Ordination...
 - i. to examine and recommend individuals sent by the member congregation for licensure by the member congregation.
 - ii. to examine, ordain, and discipline ministers in keeping with the provisions of *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)* and

iii. to examine ordained ministers seeking membership in this Conference and to make recommendations in keeping with their findings.

7.2 – Church Growth Committee

- a) A committee of five shall be elected to serve as a Church Growth Committee with three members being elected to serve a three-year rotational term with one member rotating off each year, one elected annually from the membership of the Executive Committee, and one member elected annually from the membership of the Continuing Education Committee.
- b) It shall be the duty of the Church Growth Committee to promote and support local church growth through outreach ministry and leadership development, so the Central Conference will be more fully equipped for effective ministry.
- c) The committee shall establish and coordinate a process whereby local congregation of the Central Conference may apply for funds to subsidize the cost of special church growth projects or leadership development programs.

7.3 – Clergy Care Committee

- a) A Clergy Care Committee shall be composed of three members. Each member will follow a three-year rotational term with one member rotating off each year.
- b) It shall be the duty of the Clergy Care Committee to provide and maintain a relationship with qualified and credentialed clinicians to provide counseling, coaching, and other supportive services for Ordained, Retired Ordained, and Licensed Ministers of the Central Conference and their immediate families.
- c) The Clergy Care Committee shall advise and foster relationships with other qualified mental health providers who will agree with the committee's effort and philosophy of mental health care.
- d) The committee shall establish a secure system for, when possible, anonymous service to clergy and families.
- e) The committee shall report at the annual Conference but hold in absolute confidence the personal information of clients. The report should include an up to date service utilization report and recommendations for funding.

7.4 – <u>Continuing Education Committee</u>

- a) A Continuing Education Committee shall have five elected members, with three members elected to serve three-year rotational terms, one rotating off each year; one member elected annually from the Board of Ordination membership, and one member elected annually from the membership of the Executive Committee.
- b) It will be the duty of the Continuing Education Committee to set guidelines concerning what educational resources will be recognized as qualified disciplines for our ministers to receive credit(s) as continuing education and set the number of units that can be credited for such work.
- c) The committee is to plan and promote seminars and training opportunities that will be recognized as qualified disciplines for our ministers to receive credits as continuing education.
- d) This committee is to review annually such applications as may be submitted by our ministers for continuing education units of credit and report them to the Conference in session.

7.5 Credentials Committee

- a) The Credentials Committee shall be composed of three members, shall be elected from the membership; the term of office shall be a three-year rotational term, but shall be adjusted to rotate one member off annually.
- b) The duties of the Credentials Committee shall be to check each church report for verification of delegates and to make recommendations to the Conference regarding their seat during the Conference.
- c) The committee shall also check registration cards of enrolling ministers and to make recommendations to the Conference regarding their seat during the Conference.

7.6 – Free Will Baptist Press and Church Finance Association Representative(s)

a) A representative shall be elected to represent the Conference's membership in the Free Will Baptist Press; the term of the office shall be two years.

- b) A representative shall be elected to represent the Conference's membership in the Church Finance Association, the term of the office shall be two years.
- c) Representatives are expected to attend the meetings of these ministries to represent the Central Conference's share of those ministries.

7.7 – Historian

- a) A historian shall be elected from the membership; the term of office shall be two years.
- b) It shall be the duty of the historian to collect and preserve any historical data concerning the Conference.

7.8 – Memorial Committee

- a) A Memorial Committee of three members shall be elected from the membership; the term of office shall be three-year rotational term but shall be adjusted to rotate one member off annually.
- b) It shall be the duty of the memorial committee to prepare and present a memorial service for all Central Conference ministers, spouses, or other Conference servants who die during the year preceding the Conference.
- c) The committee shall prepare a brief biographical sketch for the Historical Collection at the University of Mount Olive.

7.9 – <u>Publicity Representative</u>

- a) A Publicity Representative shall be elected from the membership; the term of office shall be two years.
- b) The duty of the Publicity Representative shall be to publicize activities and work of the Central Conference and Original Free Will Baptist Convention.
- c) The Publicity Representative shall utilize the Original Free Will Baptist Convention's website, emails, The Free Will Baptist Magazine, and any other means of public announcement.

7.10 – <u>Conference Trustees</u>

- a) A Board of Trustees consisting of three members shall be elected from the membership. The term of office shall be three years but shall be adjusted to rotate one member off annually.
- b) It shall be the duty of the board of trustees to hold in trust title(s) to all tangible property belonging to the Conference.
- c) It shall have the power to convey such property as authorized only by the annual session of the Central Conference.

Article Eight: Parliamentary Authority

The organization shall recognize the most recent edition of *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)* and the newest edition of *Robert's Rules of Order* as its parliamentary authority in meetings of the organization. Should a conflict arise between these two documents, the organization shall adhere to *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)* as the higher authority.

Article Nine: Amendment of the Constitution or Bylaws

The bylaws of the organization may be amended by the two-thirds affirmative vote of the members present at a regularly scheduled annual meeting of the organization. The amendment shall be presented and tabled in the first business session and acted upon in the final business session of the annual Conference meeting.

Article Ten: Dissolution

Upon dissolution of the organization, the Executive Committee shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all liabilities of the organization, dispose of all of the assets of the organization exclusively to the North Carolina Foundation of Christian Ministries. Any assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the Superior Court of the county in which the official office is located.

Article Eleven: Miscellaneous Bylaws

- All reports, resolutions, and recommendations shall be submitted in writing to the moderator and clerk at the appropriate time before or during the annual Conference.
- 11.2 In the judgment of the Moderator, should any member show anger on any subject, the individual shall forfeit his/her seat in that session of the meeting.
- 11.3 No member shall be excused from any session of the Conference without the authorization of the moderator. Members wishing to leave the Conference meeting before adjournment shall speak to the moderator to be excused.
- 11.4 The meeting of the Conference shall open and close with suitable devotional services and prayer as designed by the executive committee.

The Western Conference Board of Ordination met (7) times since the last annual session of the Conference. Four were scheduled meetings, two were electronic meetings where action was taken via e-mail and one was for an Ordination Service. 9. **License Period:**

There is a one-year term on the license to preach the gospel with a five-year maximum on the amount of time allowed to preach under license in preparation for ordination. If at any time the *licensed minister allows the license to lapse*, the entire licensing process must be restarted beginning with the recommendation of the local church to the Board of Ordination.

10. **Requirements for Ordination:**

We commend to our member churches and to all of our licensed ministers the attached *Requirements for Ordination*. This document will serve as a checklist for our licensed ministers as they move toward ordination. This document will also aid our churches in answering initial questions that a candidate might have in regard to the requirements for ordination.

11. **Conference Attendance:**

A. Any minister (licensed or ordained) holding membership in the Western Conference, who fails to attend the annual session of the Conference for two consecutive years or fails to send a letter showing reasonable excuse for non-attendance, is subject to censure and/or the revocation of his credentials of ordination.

B. All ministers (licensed or ordained) serving in the Western Conference in any pastoral position are required to register and attend the annual session of the Western Conference. Pastoral positions include but are not limited to pastors, associate pastors, and youth ministers. Failure to attend two consecutive years or failure to send a letter showing reasonable cause for non-attendance will subject the minister to censure and/or the revocation of credentials.

12. **Annual Convention Attendance:**

Any minister (licensed and ordained) holding membership in the Western Conference is required to register and attend at least one day of our annual two-day OFWB Convention which meets Wednesday and Thursday following the second Sunday of May on the Mount Olive College Campus. A letter stating reasonable cause will also be accepted in lieu of this requirement. It may be sent to either the Clerk of the Board of Ordination or the Clerk of the Convention).

13. Ministers Transferring into the Western Conference:

A. From Sister Conferences: These ministers must be cleared with the Western Conference Board of Ordination *prior to assuming* the pastorate to which they are called. This is the responsibility of the church calling the minister; however, the minister should be sure it has been done *prior to* beginning the prospective work. This is a simple procedure designed to protect our churches from harm. Our churches are not independent of the Conference as is true in some other denominations and groups.

B. From other Denominations: For this information you are referred to page 89 of our *Articles of Faith & Principles of Church Government*.

14. The Christian Flag Service for Ministers:

The Board of Ordination will serve as the Conference Christian Flag Committee. Any minister serving in the Western Conference at the time of his death will be given the Christian Flag Service if the minister has so requested or the family so desires. The flag will be purchased by the Conference.

15. Items for Praise:

- 1. Our newly licensed and ordained ministers
- 2. Our new members by baptism or transfer into the member churches of the Western Conference.

16. Things a Licensed Minister Can and Cannot Do:

- 1. A licensed minister *cannot* be called or hired as pastor (or associate) of any church (we need the cooperation of both our churches and our ministers on this item).
- 2. A licensed minister *can* serve a church on an interim or supply basis under the supervision of his Board of Ordination Advisor or another ordained minister as directed by the Board of Ordination. This service is to be limited to six months in any one church. If the church wishes an extension on the services of the licensed minister, the church must appeal to the Board of Ordination.
 - 3. A licensed minister *cannot* administer the ordinances of the Gospel.
 - 4. A licensed minister *cannot* perform wedding ceremonies.

- 5. A licensed minister *can* conduct worship services, preach, and teach as the opportunities are afforded to the licensed minister.
 - 6. A licensed minister *can* officiate in a funeral service.
- 7. A Licensed minister *can* be elected to serve as temporary chairman of a business meeting with the exceptions as outlined on pg. 74, paragraph 2 of *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government*.
 - 8. A licensed minister *can* vote at the annual conference.

17. **Recommendations to the Conference:**

- 1. The minister ordained since our last conference, the Reverend Luke Davis be welcomed into the Conference with the Right Hand of Fellowship by the Moderator and his name be added to the list of duly ordained ministers of the Western Conference by the Conference Clerk.
- 2. The ministers joining our conference by exchange of credentials The Reverend Chris Hall, the Reverend Fred Crank, and the Reverend Hayward W. Watford III, be welcomed into the Conference with the Right Hand of Fellowship by the Moderator and their names be added to the list of duly ordained ministers of the Western Conference by the Conference Clerk.
- 3. The newly licensed ministers, Clarence Michael Benson and Daniel Vester be added to the list of licensed ministers by the Conference Clerk.
- 4. That all our ministers, both ordained and licensed, continue to abide by our current *Ministerial Code of Ethics*.
- 5. That our churches <u>not call</u> ordained or licensed ministers from other denominations to serve as interim or to do supply work. Our churches be reminded of the statement from page 68 of <u>The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (Of the English General Baptist Heritage): "The Church shall call its own pastor from among the duly ordained Original Free Will Baptist ministers who are approved by the Conference of which the church is a member, upon such terms as shall be mutually agreeable."</u>
- 6. We request that our ministers inform the board of ordination when they resign from their church. This is so that we can assist our churches in the search process and interim period.
- 7. The Board of Ordination recommends that the Conference strongly encourage all current and future licensed ministers to attend annual workshops conducted by the Western Conference Ordaining Council or in conjunction with workshops of other Ordaining Councils, or other groups within our denomination.
- 8. That this report, in its entirety, be received by the Conference and these recommendations be accepted by the Conference as submitted.

The Moderator recognized the newly ordained minister, Rev. Luke Davis and welcomed him into the conference. Clarence Benson and Daniel Vester, licensed ministers, were unable to attend. Rev. Fred Crank and Rev. Hayward Watford, III were introduced and all were welcomed into the Western Conference with the right hand of fellowship.

The Moderator opened the floor for any new business. Rev. Braxton Carter requested permission to transfer his membership to the Western Conference from the Cape Fear. The Moderator directed the Clerk to send a letter requesting letter of recommendation from the Cape Fear Conference.

Rev. Ray Wells made a motion for the conference to contribute \$500 to the Wall of Honor in honor of Rev. Rudy Owens and Rev. Norman Gordon for their service on the Board of Ordination. The motion was seconded and passed.

A motion was made by Rev. Dr. De W. Eakes for the conference to contribute \$500 to the North Carolina Foundation for Christian Ministries and \$250 to each of the other denominational ministries. The motion was seconded and passed.

Rev. Ray Wells made a motion for the conference to purchase a new computer for the Board of Ordination, or repair the computer they currently have, not to exceed \$500. The motion was seconded and passed.

The Moderator asked for the denominational ministry representatives to come forward and report. Rev. Ronnie Hobgood, Convention President, represented Convention Services in the absence of Rev. Gary Bailey. Rev. Hobgood encouraged the conference to get back to the basics of faith as demonstrated in Acts 2. Rev. Harold Jones reported on behalf of Foreign Missions. Ms. Angela Mattox reported on behalf of Cragmont Assembly. Mr. Gary Lee reported on behalf of the Children's Home. Mrs. Gail Heath reported on behalf of Christian Education Ministry. Mrs. Sharlene Scott reported on behalf of the University of Mount Olive. Rev. Ronnie Taylor reported on behalf of Retirement Home Ministries. Mr. Rick Watson reported on behalf of the Ministerial Association. Rev. Dr. De W. Eakes reported on behalf of the Minister's Program and Rev. Dr. Rudy Owens reported on behalf of Carolina Bible Institute and Seminary. A break was enjoyed, and the conference reconvened with a congregational hymn, "Praise Him, Praise Him." An offering was then accepted.

The Reverend Charles L. Renfrow introduced the Reverend Anderson Barnes who brought a message from II Corinthians 5:16-21.

The Moderator called for the Temporary Committee reports. The Nominating Committee Report was given by Rev. David Currie. The report was received upon motion and a proper second. The floor was opened for nominations from the floor. A motion to close the nominations was made, seconded and passed. The nominating committee put into nomination the following names: Credentials Committee: Rev. Cody Proctor and Rev. Stanley Kirby with terms expiring in 2019. Board of Trustees: Rev. Don Fleming, term expiring 2019. Executive Committee: Rev. Buddy Sasser, Vice Moderator, Rev. Sherman Dilley, Treasurer and Rev. David Currie, Member-at-Large, terms expiring 2019. Board of Ordination: Rev. Terry Ellis, term expiring 2024; Rev. Lewis Forsythe to fill the unexpired term of Rev. Norman Gordon, term expiring 2021. The report was submitted by Rev. David Currie, Chair, Rev. Lloyd Hargis and Rev. Lewis Forsythe. A motion to elect the officers as presented by the Nominating Committee was made, seconded and passed.

The Moderator called for the Resolutions Committee Report and the report was given Rev. Terry Ellis. There we three resolutions presented. First, a resolution honoring Dr. Phillip Kerstetter was read. A motion to accept the resolution as presented was made, seconded and passed. Second, a resolution was presented thanking the Micro Original Free Will Baptist Church for hosting the annual conference. A motion to accept the resolution as presented was made, seconded and passed by a rising vote of thanks. Finally, a resolution stating that member churches of the Western Conference not condone or permit same sex marriages was read. A motion to accept the resolution as presented was made, seconded and passed.

Rev. Stanley Kirby gave the Credentials Committee Report. It was reported that 54 Ministers, 38 Delegates and 12 Visitors were registered, totaling 104.

The Memorial Committee Report was given by Rev. Braxton Carter who gave honor to God for the lives of the Rev. Billy Toler and the Rev. Nelson Rollins.

The Moderator opened the floor for any final business to be brought before the conference. Rev. Ray Wells made a motion that the Moderator send a letter to Dr. Phillip Kerstetter along with a copy of the resolution made in his honor. The motion was seconded and passed. A motion was made by Rev. Lewis Forsythe to give \$500 to the New Minister's Leadership Institute. The motion was seconded and passed.

Rev. Ray Wells made a motion to adjourn, leaving all unfinished business in the hands of the Executive Committee. The motion was seconded and passed, and the conference was adjourned. A delicious meal was served in the fellowship hall by members of the Micro Original Free Will Baptist Church.
